In the name of God Amen This I make my last
will Testament; In the first place I resign my soul
to God who gave it And my body It is my will that
decently interred - In the second place as to my worldly
Concerns my will is that all my just debts
of funeral expences be paid first paid out of
my Estate and I have here Samuel & Smith
& Williams & Rascos as my Executors to said
will who I have confidence in their integrity &
uprightness in the same. The third place my
will is that my Executors pay unto my Sister
Phoebe Warrill the sum of one dollar after
my debts as above stated is settled also my will
is they pay unto Demary Jones (Wife of
Thomas Jones) one dollar the Balance of my
Estate I wish Equally divided amongst all
the rest of the Lawful heirs. (My wife being
as one of said heirs) the Division of my Estate
to be by Sale or otherwise as my Executors may
think best Equitable. Signed Sealed this day
being the twenty first day of January in the year
of our Lord 1845
in the presence of us Thomas Taylor, Samuel
A. Reed, - the State of Alabama Dallas County

and for his last will & Testament that said Testator

time of Executing the same that they these
deponents signed the same as Witnesses in the
presence of & at the request of said Testator & in
the presence of each other on the day & year
