forever. Item 3^d I also gave to my daughter Phoebe
& Prandy my girl Betty her increase to her and
her heirs forever. Item 4th I gave to my daughter
Elizabeth Ann Harrell my boy Peter and girl Mary
her increase to her and her heirs forever, also one
bed and furniture and bedstead also my saddle
horse & bridle. Item 5th I gave to my son
John Harrell my boy Jack to him and
his heirs forever. Item 6th I gave to my son Har-
deman Harrell my boy Stephen to him and
his heirs forever I also gave to my grand son Gabriel
Harrell son of H J Harrell my boy Ichmull to him
and his heirs forever. Item 7th I gave to my son
Gabriel Harrell my girl Rachel and her increase
to him and his heirs forever. Item 8th I gave and be-
queath to my son Josiah Harrell my woman Feller and
her increase I also gave him my boy Samson for the
maintenance of aged John and Mary also a bed and
furniture to him and his heirs forever. Item 9th I give
all my lands to be sold and the money to be equal-
ly divided between my children I also with my
money in hand at this time say four hundred dollars
to be equally divided between my children. Item 10th
It is my will and desire that all my property
to remain on the plantation untill the crop is
made gathered and disposing of. I further wish
all my parishable property that is not previously
mentioned to be sold and the money collected
and my just debts paid the remainder to be put
at interest and the interest to go to the mainte-
nance of my sister Mary Cole during her natural
life and then after her death to be equally divided
