in manner and form as follows. Item 1st my Will
is that all my Just debts be paid without trouble or
suits at law. 2^d My Will is that all my Estate after
my death be sold to the highest bidder on a credit of
thirteen months, that is to say my Land my Stock of every
kind my household and kitchen furniture and every
other part of my Estate both real and personal. 3^d my
Will is that my wife Martha Day shall have one third
part of the money arising from said Sale after the
payment of all my Just debts to be disposed of in
the best way for her support during her natural
life. 4th My Will is that my Son Zachary Day have one
dollar out of the money arising from the Sale of my
Estate and his heirs and no more. 5th My Will is that
my Son Benjamin Day and Marshal Day have one
dollar each out of the money arising from the Sale
of my Estate to them and their heirs and no more. 6th my
Will is that the rest of the money arising from the Sale
of my Estate be equally divided between the rest of my
Children namely my Sons William Day, Silas Day,
Joshua Day, and my Daughters Sarah Thomas, Martha
Lee and Fannie Grumbles to them and their heirs.
7th and for the prosecution of this my last Will and
testament I appoint my Son William Day Executor.

Will and testament. Being on a bed of affliction but of
perfect sound mind and sound Memory. Viz- First
I desire that my beloved wife Lucy Risor and my friend
Barter H. Cleveland should be and I hereby appoint
them my Sole Executors and Comptors to transact the busi-
ness of my Estate after my death in the following man-
ner. Secondly I desire that all my just debts and funeral ex-
penses shall be paid out of the ready Money on hand
if any be, and if there be none, in that case, out of
the then present growing crop. Thirdly I desire that
the lot No one hundred and one in the plat of the
Town of Selma, shall be sold whenever in their
Opinion it shall be most to the advantage of the heirs
of my Estate, and Fourthly I desire that all my
Estate both real and personal shall be in the possession
and for the use and benefit of my beloved wife during
her natural life and widowhood, and should she
marry, then the Estate both real and personal to be
divided agreeable to law or if my wife shall give
up to one of the heirs any part, the same to be valued
and that to be part of their portion when the Estate
is divided, and further I wish all my Children that
have not had their Schooling, shall have their Schooling
out of the Estate before divided or such provision
made for them as will make them equal with the
other ones who has had their Education. Signed sealed
