In the name of God Amen I William P. Gallaher of the County of Dallas and State of Alabama, do make and declare that my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following, viz I first and principally I design my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it, hoping and believing in a remission of my sins by the merits and mediation of Jesus Christ, and my body I commit to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors— and my worldly estate I give and devise as follows to wit— 1st My Will is that my funeral expenses be paid out of my Estate residue— 2nd I give and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Eliza Leaper and the heirs of her body, Jack, Sall, Peter, Tom and bet a family of negroes in the possession of William Davidson living in St. Helena Parish State of Louisiana— 3rd I give to my beloved Daughter Sarah Hester and the heirs of her body, the following negroes, Simon Peter, Mary, Sarah and Harry, in possession of the same named Davidson. 4th I give to William Leaper and James Hester my Son-in-law, all my lands lying on Big Water, Western District of Tennessee, there being grants under two hundred and ninety four (294) and two hundred and eighty two

£250 each for five thousand acres (5000) which I have not dis-
posed of. Computed at about six thousand acres (6000) - 5th I give
Stephens & give and bequeath as follows, viz. To William Galliker Son
of George Galliker, William Son of Thomas Galliker, William Son
of James Galliker and William Son of David Galliker, eight hundred
acres of land lying and being on Hook Creek Murray County, Ten-
nessee, being part of a two thousand acre tract, granted to Robert
Hillpatrick, grant number one hundred and seventy five also four
hundred acres of land lying on Rutherford's Creek, county and State aforesaid,
being part of grant number two hundred and fourteen (214) granted
to John Walker for thirteen hundred acres, to be equally divided amongst
them. 6th I give and bequeath to my Stephens Joseph H. George Horan
Benjamin H. Galliker Sons of John Galliker decd, and to Robert Galliker
Son of Joseph Galliker the following land that is, six hundred acres in
Buffalo Valley White County Tennessee; also five hundred acres being
the one half of grant number three hundred and thirty four (334) for
one thousand acres, lying on the Carey fork County aforesaid - and also
give and bequeath unto Henry C. Hobbay one Quarter Section of land
in grant number two hundred and eighty two, lying in the South East
Corner of said grant. 7th My will is that my executors sell two town
and lots, with their appurtenances, which I have in Millersboro
Pennsylvania, and that the proceeds arising from said sale be equally
divided between my two Son-in-laws before named. William Leaper
and James Moor. 8th I further give unto the said William Leaper
my son-in-law the following negroes, to wit. Big Sam Dick Short Tom
Monday, Tuesday and Saturday, which said negroes are in the State of
Louisiana Assension Parish, under the agency of Joseph H. Galliker.
9th I give and bequeath unto the above named James Moor my son-
in-law, the following negroes viz. Gilford Bradford Peter Simon, Little
Sam and Long Tom, which said negroes are in the State of Louisiana
Assension Parish, under the agency of Joseph Galliker. 10th To Joseph
H. Galliker Son of John Galliker I give my negroes Phil and Tony,
now in his own possession in Louisiana. 11th To George Horan of
John Galliker I give my negro man Mingo now in the possession, or under
the agency of Joseph H. Galliker in Louisiana. 12th To Benjamin H.
Son of John Galliker I give my negro man Ted, now in the possession
or under the agency of Joseph Galliker in Louisiana.
13th I give and bequeath to my Stephens as follows, viz. To William
Son of George Galliker my negro man George, in the possession or
under the agency of Joseph H. Galliker in Louisiana. To William
Son of Thomas Galliker my negro man Anderson now in possession, or
under the agency of Joseph H. Galliker in Louisiana. To William
Son of James Galliker my negro man Harry, now in the possession, or
under the agency of Joseph H. Galliker of Louisiana. To William
Son of David Galliker my negro man Richard in possession or under
the agency of Joseph H. Galliker in Louisiana. 14th I give and

bequeath to my daughter Mary Negro Woman Patan's Son in case he be
his own disposal. 15th I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah
my negro woman Fidoa and her in case to be at her own disposal
Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint William Leaper of
the State of Tennessee, Joseph H. Gallishes of the State of Louisiana
and Oliver C. Stokes of the State of Alabama my Executors to this
my last will and Testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and affixed my seal this thirtieth 18th day of October AD 1830.

die; do make and ordain this my last will and Testament as to my wor-
ldly goods and to revoke all other wills and legacies by me heretofore made.
1st I desire that my body be decently buried as conveniently as may
be to those about me at the time and that all of my just debts
and funeral expenses be paid. 2nd I give and bequeath to my Son
Anthony Winter one negro boy named Julius to him and to his heirs
forever. 3rd I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Ellen two negro
women by names Bob & Ben to her and her heirs forever. 4th I give
and bequeath to my Son Robert W. Winter one negro man named
Peter to him and his heirs forever. 5th I give and bequeath to my grand
Daughter Joanna Graves my negro girl Vinny to her and her heirs forever.
6th I give and bequeath to my grand Son Lewis Morgan Barnes five
hundred dollars in money also a bed and its furniture to be paid
over to him after the division of my estate. 7th I give and
bequeath to my Son William Winter the tract of Land
known as Fraction two Township Sixteen and Range ten

11 on the East Side of the Alabama River where I now live of cultivate
also a negro woman named Rachel also one bed and ¹⁵ furniture. also half
Doz chairs and also all the kitchen furniture and also all the plantation
tools to him and his heirs for ever 8th I give and bequeath to my grand
Daughter Joanna Holly one bed and its furniture to her and her heirs
forever 9th My will and desire further is that after my death all
the balance of my Estate not herein disposed of shall be sold or better
off in 4 parts by my Executors, both real and personal, and the
net proceeds thereof to be divided into 4 equal parts by my execu-
tors. Of which my son Anthony shall be entitled to and receive one
part. My son Robert R. by deduction out of his part five hundred
dollars for monies paid to him heretofore, it to receive one part.
My Daughter Polly Gardner one part, My Daughter Sally
Brantley one part and my son William one part and my
Daughter Mary Holly one part. The two parts which I intend for
my son Robert R. and my Daughter Mary it is my wish, direct-
ions that it shall be kept by my Executors in their hands and under
their directions for the use of my son Robert R. and my Daughter
Mary for their use and the use of their heirs 10th after a division
of my property into 4 parts should each Division amount to more than
one thousand dollars it is my wish and directions that my daughter
Emily Golden shall receive one twenty one part of the
surplus over the thousand which each one of the 4 legates has received
which is specified in the month he shall have referred to. Lastly I
hereby nominate and appoint my sons Anthony Minter and William
Minter Executors to this my last will and testament. In testimony

March One thousand eight hundred and thirty One.
