to be equally divided between my Children that may
then be living or their legal heirs and I further order
and appoint Elizabeth Jones my beloved wife and
John D Jones and Susan Jones to be Executors of
this my last will and testament

Jordan Sheppard son of Abram and Eleanor Sheppard
his Wife a negro boy by the name of Jeff to him and
his heirs forever I give and bequeath unto my beloved grand-
daughter Elizabeth Sheppard daughter of Abram and Eleanor
his Wife a negro girl by the name of Abba to her and her
heirs for ever. I have given unto and delivered to my beloved
son William Wallis a tract of land. I lend unto my be-
loved son William Wallis during his natural life
the following negro Slaves viz, Sam Bep & Toby after
his death I give & bequeath said negroes viz Sam Bep
and Toby to my beloved grand daughter Margaret
& Wallis daughter of William Wallis to her & her
heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto my beloved
