and memory blessed be God do this first day of October in
the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty
six make and publish this my last will and testament in
manner following that is to say, I give that all my just
debts be paid if any I lend to my beloved Wife Elizabeth
Wallis all my Estate both real and personal during
her natural life. I have given and delivered unto my be-
loved daughter Eleanor Sheppard a negro man by the
name of Robert a negro give by the name of Peller.
I give and bequeath unto my beloved grandson Nelson
Jordan Sheppard son of Abram and Eleanor Sheppard
his Wife a negro boy by the name of Jeff to him and
his heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto my beloved grand-
daughter Elizabeth Sheppard daughter of Abram and Eleanor
his Wife a negro give by the name of Abba to her and her
heirs for ever. I have given unto and delivered to my beloved
son William Wallis a tract of land. I lend unto my be-
loved son William Wallis during his natural life
the following negro Slaves viz, Sam Bep & Toby, after
his death I give & bequeath said negroes viz Sam Bep
and Toby to my beloved grand daughter Margaret
& Wallis daughter of William Wallis to her & her
heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto my beloved

son George E Wallis the following negro slaves to wit a negro boy by the name of Cesar a negro boy by the name of Silas and a negro girl by the name of Celly. I have give my beloved daughter Margaret E West wife of Henry West her part of my property in a deed of trust with or to her brother George E Wallis for her use. I have negroes in North Carolina the number not known from not knowing the number of increased support to be nine or ten. The widow Margaret Evans wife of George Evans has a life Estate in said negroes, after her death I give and bequeath one half of said negroes to my son George E Wallis to him and his heirs forever. I find one fourth of said negroes to my beloved son William Wallis and after his death I give and bequeath the said one fourth of said negroes to his children and to be equally divided among them. to them and their heirs forever. I find unto my beloved daughter Eleanor Sheppard the remaining fourth of said negroes during her natural life after her death I give and bequeath the said remaining fourth of said negroes to her children to them and their heirs forever and I hereby make and ordain my beloved Wife Elizabeth Wallis and my trusty friend Thomas O. Holliday and George E Wallis Executors of this my last will & testament.
