Valley Spring Baptist Church

the may meet monthly or oftener if thought expedient by the Church

this Church shall not receive any member into the union only by experience and Baptism ^{and by letter of conference} and the Baptism to be administered by a regular ordained minister in full fellowship and he to signify the same Reception by giving the right hand of Fellowship

this Church shall have a moderator chosen annually the pastor shall preside if present if not the Church shall choose a moderator whose duty it shall be to put all questions and take the sense of the Church unless the motion is withdrawn by the mover and shall not vote himself only in case of an equal division the Church then he shall give the casting vote he may speak ^{as moderator} but shall not vote ^{as moderator}

the Church shall choose a Clerk annually whose duty it shall be to keep a fair record of all the proceedings of the Church ^{shall call} except if not the Church choose a moderator

no matter of dealing shall claim the attention of the Church but those that have been brought under the rule laid down in the 18th of St Matthew

any question brought into the Church which affects the fellowship of the Church shall be unanimous

amendments to this Constitution may be made when two thirds of the her members think the same require it

All matters but those above recited when it becomes necessary to take the sense of the Church shall be given ^{by a majority}

this Church will not have any ^{fellowship} with the members of any ^{other} Church ^{or} society called ^{or} unscriptural or those who advocate them

Constitution

this Church shall be known by the name of the Valley Spring Baptist Church

they may meet monthly or oftener if thought expedient by the Church

this Church shall have a moderator chosen annually the pastor shall preside if present if not the Church shall choose one pastor whose duty it shall be to put all questions and take the sense of the Church unless the motion is withdrawn by the mover and shall vote himself only in case of an equal division of the Church then he shall give the casting vote he may speak in debate by giving his seat by some other person

the Church shall choose a clerk annually whose duty it shall be to keep a fair Record of all the proceedings of the Church if present if not the Church shall choose one pastor

no matter of dealing shall claim the attention of the Church but those that have been brought under the rule laid down in the 18th of St Matthew

any question brought in to the Church which affects the Fellowship of the Church must be unanimous

Articles of Faith

- #1 we believe in only one true and living God

worlds that they should be holy without
blame before him in all things
#4 we believe in the doctrine of original sin
and mans inability to recover him self
from the falling state he is in by nature
by his own free will and ability
#5 we believe that sinners are justified in the
light of God only by the imputation of the
righteousness of Jesus Christ
#6 we believe that God elects shall be cold
affectionately regenerated and sanctified by
the holy Ghost and shall persevere in
grace and never finally fall away
#7 we believe that Baptism and the Lords Supper
are ordinances of Jesus Christ and that
true believers are the only subjects of the
ordinance and the true mode of Baptism
is immersion
#8 we believe in the Resurrection of the dead
and general judgment and that the
punishment of the wicked will be eternal
and the joys of the righteous everlasting
#9 we believe that no minister has a right
to administer the ordinance only such
as are called of God as was Aaron and Corne-
lius under the power of imputation of hands
