The Church shall be known by the name of the

Worshipper Baptist Church

The meeting monthly or oftener if thought expedient
by the Church

This church shall not receive any member into union
only by confession of faith and the baptism
to be administered by a regular ordained minister in
full fellowship and he to signify the same reception
by giving the right hand of fellowship

This church shall have a moderator chosen annually to
preside if present if not the church shall choose one
whose duty it shall be to put all questions and take
answers of the church's meeting the motion is withdrawn by the motion
and shall not vote himself only in case of equal division
the church then he shall give the casting vote whom speak
first shall fill the seat by some brother present

Church shall choose a Clerk annually whose duty it shall
be to keep a full record of all the proceedings of the church
meeting if not the church choose another

No matter of dealing shall claim the attention of the church
but those that have been brought under the rule laid
down in the 18th of St Matthew

Any question brought into the church which affects the salvation
of the church shall be unanimous

Amendments to this constitution may be
made when two thirds of the members think the
same require it

All motions unto this church shall be given
by a majority

This church will not have ~~any~~ ^{any} ~~falsely called~~ ^{rightly called} the

that advocate them

present

This church shall choose a Clerk annually
whose duty it shall be to keep a full
record of all the proceedings of the church
if present if not the church shall choose one
brother

No matter of dealing shall claim the attention
of the church but those that have been brought
under the rule laid down in the
18th of St Matthew

Any question brought into the church
which affects the fellowship of the church
must be unanimous
