

Daniel M. Martin, Guardian of George Walker, a Lunatic, comes before Judge John H. Norwood to report that in compliance with a Court Order, on November 1, 1858 he has sold at Public Auction in the Town of Stevenson, the land ordered to be sold, to Matthew Washington, for the sum of Five thousand one hundred and thirty dollars. Washington has given his note payable on the first Monday in November 1861 with interest from date and the interest to be paid at the end of each year, with William Washington as his security. Sworn Nov 14<sup>th</sup> 1858 before J. H. Norwood by Daniel M. Martin, Guardian. The Land is not described here but on pages 482-484, dated 24 Feb 1859, the Annual settlement of the Guardian, Daniel M. Martin, represents a rather large settlement.

D. M. Martin also reports that on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December 1858, he sold at public auction, in the Town of Bellefonte, Betsy and four children, Tops, Elizabeth, William and Margaret, to Matthew Washington for the sum of \$3385.00, and Thomas Nathan to Matthew Washington for \$1285.00.
