though debilitated in body yet through the
Mercy of indulgent God, blessed with a
sound mind, do hereby constitute my last

In the first place I commend my soul to that
merciful and merciful God, from whom I
first received it,
after the payment of all my just and law-
ful Debt, I will and bequeath to my wife
beloved wife Mary during life a com-
fortable Maintenance, from the proceeds
of my plantation I further bequeath unto her
during her life and my negroes.

Seven in number named as follows
Jane, and her six children, Murrell, John
Stark, Franky, Percy, & Daniel. I likewise
bequeath her all my black & two cows excepted
I likewise will give her all my household
furniture it is further my will that
my stockess shall be sold to the best
advantage, and the money to be appropriated
for the use of the family.

I will and bequeath unto my son Charles
A proportionable share of my plantation for
his maintenance, and at the decease
his mother to have peculiar possession
of all my farm and effects. I further
bequeath unto him the two cows & ^{any} horses
It is further my will that said son
account accounts after discharging his
debts shall be appropriated to the liquidation
of the debt on my land.

It is further my will that a deed of gift
by me to be given to my son Marcus, shall
be in force or notice ~~the~~ until the decease
of my wife. Said deed is respecting seven
Negroes before mentioned, and there is
treasure.

It is my will that a negro woman named
Jane, is to be emancipated agreeable to a clause
to be put in said deed, that is after she shall
have born four children it is likewise my
will that the before named child daughter of
the said Jane, a Malatta Girl Born at about the
26th 1812. shall be emancipated when she shall
have attained the age of twenty one,
and to my Grandson Andrew John Mosey
I bequeath the negro boy Daniel before named
It is also my will further that if either
my son or Grandson, or both of them feel
desirous to emancipate any or all of said
negroes, they are hereby authorized to do so accord-
ing to a clause to be put in said deed, it is
further my will that as soon as the laws
of the County or State they may live in
render it possible to emancipate them without
involving either my son or Grandson, or
both of them, there here execution in dispo-
sition. it is my will that the said negro
and thus saying shall be emancipated in
the following manner, that is, as they may
arrive at twenty ^{five} years of age
a clause in said deed will carry or convey
this idea. I further bequeath to my niece
