

The Constitution

Alabama, Talladega County
July 30, 1842.

Articles of Constitution of the Baptist Church of Christ at
Mt. Zion.

We, a few Brethren and Sisters of the Primitive Baptist Order, scattered through the Hillside Country, being convinced that it is our duty to embody ourselves into a Church in order to keep house for God. We have a meeting, called Brother A. Saxon to the Chair and Brother D. C. Elton, Secretary for the Convention, to read the Articles of Faith to which we all agreed. Then appointed time to come into a Constitution. On Wednesday before the Third Saturday in August next, at the house of John Vickers on the following Faith upon which we call the following Brethren: John Blackstone, I. M. Duke, Thomas Britton and B. Jowers, To which we agree to be constituted the Articles of Faith, to-wit:

Art. 1. We believe in one True and Living God. There are but Three Persons in the Godhead, The Father, Son and Holy Ghost.

Art. 2. We believe the Scripture of the Old and New Testament to be the Words of God and the only rule of Faith and Practice.

Art. 3. We believe that God elected and Ordained his People in Christ before the Foundation of the World. That they should be Holy and without Blame before His Loveliness.

Art. 4. We believe in the Doctrine of Original Sin and Man's Impotency to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by Nature, but free will and ability.

Art. 5. We believe that we are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed Righteousness of Jesus Christ.

Art. 6. We believe that God's Elect shall be effectually called, regenerated and Sanctified by the Holy Ghost and shall follow in Grace and never finally fall away.

Art. 7. We believe that Baptism and the Lord's Supper are Ordinances of Jesus Christ and that True Believers are the only persons subject to those Ordinances and the True Mode of Baptism is Immersion.

Art. 8. We believe in the resurrection of the Dead and a General Judgment and that the punishment of the Wicked shall be everlasting and that the Joys of the Righteous shall be Eternal.

Art. 9. We believe that no Minister has a right to administer

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ter the Ordinances only such as are called of God as was Aaron, and even under imposition of bonds by a presbytery and in Fellowship with the Church which he is a Member.

Art. 10. We believe that God has Ordained Good Works that his Children should walk in them and that Good Works are only such as God hath commanded in his Word and got such as without the warrant thereof devised by Men out of Blind Zeal or upon the pretense of good intentions.

Art. 11. We believe that washing the Saints' Feet was Ordained by Christ to be done by his followers in a Church Capacity until his Second Coming.

Upon which we, whose names are hereunto assigned presented ourselves before Brother John Blackstone and Thomas Britton, Ministers of The Gospel to Constitute into a Church.

The First Conference

Alabama, Talladega County
August the 17th, 1842.

The Baptist Church of Christ at Mount Zion Met in Conference. Appointed Brother Blackstone Moderator.

Ist. Open the Doors of the Church for the Reception of Members. None came forward.

2nd. Agreed that we adopt the following resolution to keep off All Institutions which have so much marred the Peace of the Baptists in the World, to-wit:

Resolved that the Institutions generally called viz: Bible Society, Tract Society, Temperance Society, Sunday School Un-

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ion Society and all the Societies Militating to the Missionary Plan now existing in the U. S. are Unscriptural and that we as a Church Will Not hold in Our Fellowship those who are engaged in the above Named Institutions. Adjourned until tomorrow.

August the 18th, 1842

Met Thursday Pursuant to Adjournment

1st. Appointed Brother Blackstone Moderator.
2nd. Open the Doors for the Reception of Members. None came forward.

3rd. Went into Choice of a Clerk for the Church. Brother S. A. Wheeles was Appointed.

4th. Appointed a Committee to Select a place for the Meeting House. For which we have appointed Brethren S. A. Wheeles, D. C. Edison, James Johnston, Wiley Wiett and John Criswell.

Adjourned until Saturday before the Fourth Sunday in September next.

ORIGINAL DECORUM OF MT. ZION CHURCH

Alabama, Talladega County
November 4, 1848

The Baptist Church of Christ at Mt. Zion having given ourselves to each other and to the Lord to keep house for God having agreed to adopt the following rules to be governed by:

The Moderator, or his Supply, shall act as Moderator and in his absence the Church Clerk shall act as Moderator.

II. The Church shall have a regular clerk, and in his absence a clerk pro tem. It shall be the duty of the clerk to keep a regular record of all business enacted on, or by the Church.

III. The Conference may be opened in any way the Moderator may see fit, and when opened invite visiting brethren and sisters to seat with us.

IV. Open the doors for the reception of members.

V. Inquire for references.

VI. Inquire for acknowledgments.

VII. Inquire for Declines in Gospel Order.

VIII. Inquire for Miscellaneous Business.

IX. It shall be the duty of each male member to attend each monthly conference. In case of failure, it shall be their

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duty to assign their reasons for non-attendance at the next conference.

X. It shall be the duty of the deacons to notice all cases of failure of each man, member, or members, neglecting to attend two consecutive conferences.

XI. And in case that a member, or members, is known to miss two conferences, it shall be the duty of said deacons to report said member, or members, to the next conference.

XII. In such cases it shall be the duty of the Church to appoint two or more members to visit such defaulters and admonish them to their duty, and in case of their non-adherence it shall be the duty of the Church to withdraw from such member, or members, in consequence of their neglect of duty.

XIII. It shall be the duty of the Church to call any male or female, hearing or seeing an evil report against another member of said Church if their feelings is impaired. In consequence of such report or reports, to keep it to themselves until they can see such member, or members, and acquaint them of their dissatisfaction, and if satisfaction cannot be obtained, then the duty of such members then shall be to take one or two more members with him. If satisfaction cannot be obtained, it shall be their duty to report said transgression, or transgressions, to the Church, and then it shall be the duty of the Church to deal with all such cases as may require.

XIV. If any member, or members, knowing or hearing an evil report and lets it by for two or more regular conferences, and afterwards brings it up, they shall be subject to a charge for unfaithfulness and shall be dealt with accordingly.

XV. Every move and second shall come under the notice of the moderator and shall be a vote taken on it, unless the motion is withdrawn.

XVI. A majority of this Church shall rule in all cases, only in matters touching of fellowship.

XVII. Every member speaking on matters pertaining to the conference shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator, and shall not be interrupted while speaking except he depart from the subject, and then it shall be the duty of the Moderator to call him to order.

XVIII. No member, or members, shall absent himself from the conference without the leave of the Moderator.

XIX. The Moderator shall be allowed the privilege of speaking in all cases provided the chair be filled, but in no case allowed a vote only in case of a tie.

XX. Any member, or members, transgressing shall be dealt with according as the transgression may require.

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HISTORY OF MT. ZION PRIMITIVE BAPTIST CHURCH

Mt. Zion Primitive Baptist Church was constituted August 17, 1842 in a sparsely settled section of the Hillsboro Country in what was then the southeastern part of Tallapoosa County, Alabama. The scattered Primitive Baptist members met at the house of John Britton and John Howell as their addresses were the Convention which was held July 25, 1842. Elders John Blackstone and Thomas Britton whose names were called for the constitution were present and organized into a presbytery and proceeded according to the constitution which you have heard read.

On the day of constitution they held the first conference and enacted the resolutions denouncing the innovations of men. On the next day they chose Bro. S. A. Wheeler for church clerk, and appointed Brethren S. A. Wheeler, D. C. Edmon, James Johnston, W. J. Williams and John Howell as a committee to select a place for the meeting house. They selected a location which was $\frac{1}{2}$ mile south of Lineville, Alabama on the Mellow Valley road on which the first meeting house was built. The first meeting house was occupied from April 27, 1844 until August 22, 1851 at which time they moved to a point $\frac{1}{2}$ miles southeast of Ashland on the Mellow Valley road. The Church met there regularly until 1871 when they sold the building and moved by free will into a vacant house belonging to Bro. C. W. Moore until we received our new meeting house on February 4, 1871. This location was about 5 miles SW of Ashland, Alabama, and $\frac{1}{2}$ mile south of the Ashland-Goodwater Highway from Harkins Cross Roads. We occupied that building until Dec. 6, 1890, when we moved into our present building, where we still worshiped for the last 52 years. The Building Committee for the present building was composed of individuals who belonged to families who pioneered in the settlement of the community where the church now stands, 4½ miles SW of Ashland, Clay County, Alabama, and 1½ miles north of Harkins Cross Roads from the Ashland-Goodwater Highway. The Building Committee was composed of Bro. J. T. Willis, Bro. R. D. Ray and Friend F. M. Pruet.

On July 25, 1843 Mt. Zion Church joined the Beulah Primitive Baptist Association and were admitted into the same, 1871, at which time without leaving the Beulah in order to enter into the constitution of the Hillsboro Primitive Baptist Association of which she has been a component member from that time until now.

Soon after constitution Mt. Zion Church set her meeting time on the 4th Sunday and Saturday before in each month at 11:00 a.m. For short periods of time the meeting time has been

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changed to other Sundays. For the past half-century the regular meeting time has almost been continuously on the first Sunday and Saturday before in each month. The Annual Meeting convenes the 1st Sunday in August beginning on Friday before, at which time the Annual Conference is held, some of the proceedings of which are to choose our pastor, elect delegates to the Association, raise our minute and associational funds, and to arrange for the communion and feet-washing on Sunday.

Sixteen members composed the charter membership of Mt. Zion Church. From this nucleus the membership has grown from time to time until it now numbers 144 members on the church rolls. Never have there been fewer than the charter membership. During the days of slavery there were several negro members. The first members to be baptized into the fellowship of the church were Sister Mary Saxon and Sister Elvira Saxon, respectively. There have been as many as 14 members received into the fellowship at one time. Our membership today consists of 44 members as listed below:

Among the members of our church we have had the following men who have served to lead the body, twelve Elders. Silas Monk, who was also the first pastor of our Church; Bro. I. D. Jordan was the first to be Liberated and Bro. Alex Allen was the second Licensed Minister. Elder N. H. Clayton was the first to be Ordained. Others were, Elders J. Pace, G. B. Knight, James Green, John Parsons, N. M. Cook, R. G. Harris, D. L. Riley and B. B. Finley.

Two of our charter members were deacons, Brethren John Criswell and Charles Jordan. Brethren D. C. Eidson and Wiley Wiett were the two first deacons to be ordained by Mt. Zion Church. Other Deacons have been Brethren Jesse Willingham, M. W. Rain, J. T. Willis, W. W. McMath, J. T. Willis, R. E. Green, and the present deacons, A. H. Finley, R. M. Wallace and Ben Parsons.

Brother D. C. Eidson served the Church as Clerk in the preliminary Convention and also in the Constitution of the Church. In the first regular conference after the constitution of the Church, the first Clerkship was chosen to remain Clerk. Other Clerks during the history of the Church have been: Brethren D. C. Eidson, Gabriel Adams, Wiley Wiett, Calin McCain, Jefferson Riley, J. J. Mitchell, H. M. Hearn, J. W. Meeks, S. W. Pruet, J. T. Willis, J. A. Brooks, S. E. Pruet, A. H. Finley, and the present clerk, Bro. R. M. Wallace.

Mt. Zion Church has been served by the following pastors in addition to Elder Silas Monk who served as pastor from Nov. 1842 until Oct. 26, 1849; Elder Absalom Blythe, served one year as

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pastor; Elder N. H. Clayton from the time of his ordination, Oct. 1851, until June 1, 1854; Elder Robert Clayton from Aug. 6, 1855 until Sept. 4, 1855; Elder John M. Duke from June 1, 1854 until Jan. 6, 1855; and again from Nov. 10, 1855 until Feb. 11, 1858; Elder W. L. Taylor from Feb. 11, 1858 until Aug. 31, 1861; Elder Elijah Garrett from Oct. 5, 1861 until Feb. 3, 1873; Elder John Gandy from Feb. 3, 1873 until Feb. 3, 1877; Elder G. B. Knight from Feb. 3, 1877 until Oct. 1878; Elder N. M. Cook from Oct. 6, 1888 until Aug. 26, 1890, for a year of which he was assisted by Elder J. N. Parsons; Elder S. W. Pruet from Aug. 31, 1897 until Aug. 31, 1914, and again from Aug. 6, 1916 until May 31, 1919; Elder H. G. Harris from Jan. 2, 1916 until Aug. 6, 1916; and again from May 31, 1919 until Sept. 3, 1922; Elder H. H. Goodman Sept. 3, 1922 until Aug. 14, 1929 and again from Aug. 14, 1929 until present time and has agreed to serve us continuously until the present time and has agreed to be our two ministers living that have pastored Mt. Zion Church and are both present at this Centennial Meeting.

Mt. Zion Church faithfully met and worshipped the Lord during the trying hours of the War Between the States and the dark Reconstruction period which followed the war, and other conflicts that have arisen. Many other events have occurred in her history. Neither Mt. Zion nor Grace Church records were received by Mt. Zion Church; therefore the names of individuals from distinguished pioneer families have belonged to the Church during the past half-century among which families represented were the Willis, Pruet, Parsons, Ray Richardson, and Brooks.

Mt. Zion Church has ever been satisfied with the discipline of the Scriptures in the receiving, caring for, and dismissal of her members. We have regularly received members according to the Law of the Lord under four heads, namely: (1) experience of salvation; (2) baptism when presented in person; (3) restoration when evidence of reformation was offered and confession made for sins; (4) by confession of faith when the church of one's membership became extinct or had strayed and after gospel labor had been bestowed and order failed to be re-established and the church had been withdrawn from. We have endeavored to admonish our members to active duty in the service of our Lord and any reprehensible erring in a living gospel manner that we might save them from error. Transgressions have arisen in which Scriptural principles were denied, falsehoods were advocated, and immoral conduct was engaged in, which in order to save the Church we executed the Law of the Lord by withdrawing from such disorders. We hold that no member gets

his membership when he gets his letter, and that the Church is responsible for said member until he places his letter in another church of the same faith and order, or is withdrawn from by the church of his membership.

We, the membership of Mt. Zion Primitive Baptist Church in her Hundredth Anniversary on Sept. 12 and 13, 1942, whose names are listed below, are endeavoring to keep house for the Lord according to the Scriptures. We are satisfied with the principles, practices, order and government upon which Jesus Christ set up the church of which Mt. Zion Church was constituted and has observed this hundred years. We pass this record on to the generations that are yet to come, hoping and praying that its contents may be preserved, that Mt. Zion Church will continue to live, and that the Second Hundredth Anniversary will still find you free from the doctrine and commandments of men, and that you are holding fast to the Faith once delivered to the Saints. We have suffered no schisms and divisions and with but one or two exceptions no more than six members guilty of sedition at one time.
