Samuel Bowdon's Last Will and Testament

In the name of God - Amen I Samuel Bowdon of Shelby County Alabama being feeble in health but of sound mind and memory do make this my last will in manner and form following that is to say.

Imprimis - my will is that all my just debts and funeral charges shall by my executors herein after named be paid out of my estate as soon as after my decease as shall by them be found convenient - to effect which payment it is my will that my executors sell my present growing crop and the following two negroes - viz - Sam a negro man and Becca a negro woman aged about sixteen and so much of the stock of horses, cattle, hogs, and sheep as may be necessary for the purpose aforesaid all or such portion at the discretion of my executors as may be by ~~them~~ deemed expedient - Item - it is my will that all my real estate of every description be the property of all my children to be sold at the discretion of my executors at such time and manner as they shall judge most conducive to the interest of all interested and till sold said lands to remain in the care and management of my executors either to be rented out or cultivated by the negroes belonging to the children herein after named - viz - Elbert William, Nancy, Samuel, Sarah and Mary.

Item - It is also my will that in case the negroes belonging to my children above named be employed on the plantation then my executors to account to each for the value of the services of said negroes for such time as they may be so employed and also account to each of the heirs for their respective shares of the rent or profits of the land.

Item - It is my will that all my negroes (excepting the two herein before named if sold and if not sold then also to be included) be divided amongst my children to be appraised and divided by three commissioners to be appointed for that purpose by the Judge of the County Court of Shelby County and in case any difficulty should arise in making such distribution just and equal the

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said distribution to be made as far as practicable and the residue to be sold and the proceeds of such sale to be divided to make the distribution equal

Item - It is my will that before any distribution of my estate there be deducted and set apart the sum of sixteen hundred dollars to be divided equally among his four children Elbert, Samuel, Sarah and Mary in addition to their distributive shares which sum may be raised out of the sale of my personal property herein before authorized to be sold if the same shall be sufficient after the payment of my debts and if not then out of my other property at the discretion of my executors which sum to be due and payable at the expiration of four years from this date

Item - It is my will that in the distribution of my slaves there be included a negro boy already given by me to my daughter Caroline McHenry that her share be assumed to the value of said negro boy so as to make her share equal with the others

Item - I acknowledge to be indebted to my son Lewis in the sum of four hundred dollars which it is my will be paid by my executors with my other debts

Item For the better education and nurture of my infant children Elbert William Nancy Samuel Sarah and Mary I give and dispose of the tuition and custody of them till my sons attain the age of Twenty one years ~~of age~~ and the daughters attain the age of Eighteen years or marry to my executors and It is my will that they have good education and the sons to have liberal education if they so desire and my executors shall judge best to be paid for out of their respective shares

Item It is my will that my executors have the sole care and custody of the respective shares of my infant children till the boys attain the age of twenty one years and the daughters attain the age of eighteen years or marry and they are hereby authorizing to invest the money which may belong them in the purchase of other property if they shall judge

better than to loan the same

Item It is my will that my household furniture farming tools and all other property not before mentioned be sold or retained for the use of the family as my executors shall judge best after so much has been sold as shall be sufficient to pay all my just debts

I nominate and appoint as two sons Franklin W Bowdon and Lewis Bowdon to be the executors of this my last will and testament giving to them ^{full} power to execute fully this my last will and testament to and full power and authority in case of the sale of any of my real estate to execute titles in fee simple to the same and all other power necessary to effect the object of this my will - And to make distribution to each of my heirs ~~by~~ my two executors Caroline age Henry Elizabeth Moody and the six infant children herein before named Each to have an equal share excepting the sixteen hundred dollars set apart for the four infant children before named - and this is to be in addition of their equal shares and also excepting the Negro boy Manuel given to Caroline McHenry whose share is to be assumed by the value of said boy

in said will as of his distributive share

2^o The Value London Lucy and Willis at the sum
of fourteen hundred and fifty dollars (\$1,450.00)
and assign them to Lewis T. Bowdon - one of the
heirs named in said will as of his distributive share

3^o In accordance with the will aforesaid we find
that the share of one of the heirs to wit Caroline H.
Henry wife of Thomas D. H. Henry is to be lessened
to the value of a negro Boy named Man heretofore
given by said decedent to said Caroline The value said
negro man at seven hundred dollars (\$700.00) The
further Value Robert at five hundred dollars (\$500.00)
and assign the said Robert to said Caroline as of her
distributive share

4^o The Value Jerry at eight hundred dollars (\$800.00)
and assign him to Elbert another heir as his share
- to wit to Elbert Bowdon

5^o The Value Barwell and Taylor at one thousand and
fifty dollars and assign them to William Bowdon as of
his distributive share

6^o The Value Henry at the sum of eight hundred dollars
(\$800.00) and allot him to Nancy Bowdon also one of
said heirs as of her distributive share

7^o The Value Jack and Jim at eleven hundred dollars
(\$1,100.00) and allot them to Samuel Bowdon also one
of said Heirs as of his distributive share

8^o The same Bob and Kate at Eleven hundred and fifty
dollars (\$1,150.00) and allot them to Sarah Bowdon
one of said heirs as of her distributive share

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g^t the same Anthony and Merica at nine hundred
and fifty dollars and allot them to Mary Bowdon
also one of said heirs as of her distributive share
10th the same Peter and Hannah at twelve hundred
and fifty dollars \$1250⁰⁰) and allot them to Elizabeth
Moody wife of Washington Moody also one of said heirs
as of her distributive share

According to our salvation we make one thousand
seventy ~~hundred and fifty~~ ^{\$1075.00} dollars worth of negroes their
average value. One each of the aforesaid heirs from the
said estate. In accordance with the will of said
Decedent and in pursuance of our power and duties
under the said will we set apart from this division
the aforesaid negroes Becca and Isham to be sold or
disposed by the executors of said Samuel Bowdon deceased
in such way as to make this distribution just Becca
we value at five hundred dollars and Isham at three
hundred dollars. The Executors are to make the share
of each heir worth one thousand seven ~~hundred and fifty~~ ^{\$1075.00}
dollars & if the negroes allotted to any heir according to
our valuation should not be worth that sum the Exec-
utors must make up the deficiency in money. If the
share allotted to any heir should be worth more than one
thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars such heir
must pay over to the executors aforesaid such
overplus.

Approvment of the Estate of Sam'l Bowdon

Shelby County Judge of the orphans court

Court to appraise the Estate of Samuel Bowdon deceased late of said County have endeavored to perform the task assigned, and the result of our efforts in the premises submit the following report.

1st We have upon examination ascertained that the said estate embraces Twenty Three Negroes of various ages and of both sexes to wit London, Lucy, Taylor, Maria, Liza, Isham, Betsy, Peter, Hannah, Henry, George, Willis, Hob, Jack, Anthony, Burwell, Robert, Rose, Kate, Charlotte, Philip, Margaret and Morrison and we estimate their aggregate value to be Ten Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$10,500.00). In this estimate we give the above mentioned Negroes Morrison to be wholly valueless from disease.

2nd We find the said estate to embrace also eight head of horses & mules which we value aggregate at the sum of Five hundred and fifty Dollars (\$550.00) -

3rd We value the cattle belonging to said estate being about fifty five in number at the sum of Three hundred and forty eight Dollars (\$348.00)

4th We find the value of the sheep being Thirty two in number at Sixty four Dollars (\$64.00)

5th said estate embraces farming utensils of various descriptions, Two guns - Two Wagons - Blacksmith Tools - One Thresher - Wheat fan and Jersey Waggons which we value at four hundred and Twenty one Dollars = (\$471.00)

6th The Hogs of said estate we value at the aggregate sum of one hundred & sixty eight Dollars these being eighty six in number.

7th The said estate includes also about eight hundred and forty acres of land known and described as follows To wit The North East quarter and the South East quarter - also the East half of the South West quarter of Section ten. Also the North east quarter of section fifteen also The West half of the North West quarter of section fourteen all in Township Twenty Two Range Three East and The West half of the South West quarter and the West half of the North West quarter of section eleven To twenty Two and Range Three West

Besides about Forty acres more or less embracing Shoal Creek and the banks on both sides for some distance, and extending from the head of the mill pond to the said creek the mill seat being included & belonging to said estate of Samuel Bowdon deceased now it extending down said creek about as far as Shoal Creek meeting it all lying in Shelby County in the district of lands subject to entry at Las Calvaria - valuable lands with the improvement and appurtenances thereto appertaining. We value at the sum of Five Thousand Eight hundred and Twenty four Dollars,

8th upon a review we find the personal property of said estate to be worth the sum of twelve thousand four hundred and fifty one Dollars (\$12,451.00) we find the real estate to be worth Five thousand eight hundred & Twenty four dollars (\$5,824.00) making the aggregate sum of eighteen thousand Two hundred and twenty five Dollars (\$18,275.00) The real estate above mentioned is by us appraised and considered in the nature of personal property pursuant to our appointment and in conformity with the will of said Samuel Bowdon deceased giving his executors discretionary power to sell said land in manner to them may seem proper and account for the proceeds, or to retain and cultivate the same.

that my negroes stock & furniture remain upon
my farm under the direction and control of
my executors for his maintenance and support
directing and requesting that my executors do
and perform all things out of my estate
for his support and earthly comfort and should
my said brother John survive me or when
he and I are no more I desire that my stock
farming utensils and every thing else that I
may have be sold under the directions of the
orphans Court of said County and under
the directions of my executors and that my just
debts be paid out of the proceeds next I give
and devise to my brother Joseph Watson and
to his heirs one dollar next I give and devise to my
brother William Watson one dollar next I give to my
brother Alexander Watson my plantation of Landon
which I now live consisting of about two hundred
acres also all my house hold furniture next
after the death of my self & my said brother John
I desire and direct that my negroes Vig, Mary
Cesar, Chang, Kate Sally and her child Alexander
with their increase if any under the direction
of the orphans Court of said County and under
the super attendance of my executors be appraised
by three disinterested men that the said negroes
shall be permitted to choose their own purchasers
and that is an inducement to those to purchase them
from the negroes may choose that purpose I
direct that the purchasers be permitted to take
each for fifty dollars less than their said
appraisal as to my first Kate I desire

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and desired my executors in consequence of her
crippled situation particularly to see that she
is well treated during life - Then I desired
that the proceeds of the sale of my negroes be
divided equally between my said Brother Alexander
and my Sister Philadelphia McCray or
their heirs in testimony there to be equal
heirs in all except the land and house
furniture before given to Alexander next
in consideration of one hundred Dollars which
I owe Charles Richardson and in considera-
tion of his kindness to me at the death of myself
and brother John I desire that he have two
hundred Dollars next I desire that an
obligation this day made by me and bearing
even date here with, with conditions in it to John
McClenahan if not paid before the death of
myself and brother John be paid according to
its terms next I do revoke all former wills, testaments
and codicils and hereby nominate and
constitute and appoint Charles Richardson
and John McClenahan executors with equal
powers of this my last will & testament and
desire that if necessary they will attend to the
business of my farm and negroes and take
such care of brother John and myself as our
circumstances and conditions may require un-
