 can that surplus & direct & desire that my said Executors
 sell & convey so much of my real estate as shall be
 necessary for that purpose to be by them selected and sold
 after discretion paying a sale of my land rather
 than my negroes and by said direct that my negroes
 remain on my plantation at Wilson Hill for farming
 purposes under the direction of Executors in so many of them
 as may be from time to time necessary to carry the farm
 and that the rest be hired out until I direct a direct
 that at my decease all my personal property except my
 Mr. Negroes and a sufficient amount of stock for use and
 tools necessary for carrying on the farm be sold under
 the direction of the Orphans of said County & that the
 profits arising from my farm & negroes be first employed in
 the support of my family, next & direct and direct that
 my two sons Samuel B. Roper and Nathan C. Roper receive
 a good academic education & if at proper age they or
 either of them agree with the consent of their Guardians
 I direct that they receive a collegiate education next I
 direct devote all my money means arising from the negroes
 and farm the debts due to me & from a sale of such property
 as may be sold or not used in the payment of my debts
 the support of my family & the education of my sons
 to be put in a common fund & placed at interest next
 I desire direct begeth & desire that my wife Elizabeth
 M. Roper, my two sons Samuel B. Roper & Nathan C. Roper
 inherit my entire estate and the equal heirs to the same
 and that the same remain undivided to the discretion of
 my said wife and the Guardians of my said sons hereinafter
 named and that when a division of the same is desired by my
 said wife or the Guardians of my said sons that the same
 be done under the direction of the Orphans Court of said
 County and that the same real & personal estate before
 disposed of be divided into three equal parts & here and
 enjoyed as before suggested & desired intending them to
 be equal heirs in all and should my said wife or
 Elizabeth M. Roper at any time prefer to remove to her
