

First I direct that all my debts and just expenses be paid as soon after my decease as possible out of the first money that shall come into the hands of my executors from any portion of my estate shall be demanded. I shall bequeath my birth to my daughter Catherine Galloway a Negro Girl married Earth about six years old. All other personal property of the value of seventy dollars I have also given to my daughter Peniticia Lake our Negro Girl married Earth about six years old and personal property of the value of one hundred dollars these gifts above mentioned I now esteem I also give and bequeath to my daughter Almira Lolley a Negro Girl married Earth and other personal property of the value of twenty dollars whatever the necessary uses of the rest of my estate both real personal I give to my beloved wife Nancy and the remainder of my children (to wit) Barbara Lolley & the Pauley Martha Lolley Ann Lolley and Lucy Lolley this portion of my estate which I desire for my wife to have is for her use the children use and is able to remain in the possession of my wife and as any of my children the last five named shall become of age so many I wish them to have property equivalent to that given to the first three persons in this will. But provided my wife should marry again and it should appear evident to my executors that a considerable portion of my estate left in the hands of my wife is likely to be wasted or diverted from my first born & children as above named then I wish all my estate then remaining to be sold and to be divided between my wife & children giving to my wife ten sixth part of all the property left in her hands at my death and the increase thereof to the time of such conveyance and the rest to equally among
