Know all men by these presents that whereas, (to wit) and the 5th day of October A.D. 1851, a certified copy of the assessment of the State and County Tax, for the County of Washington and State of Alabama, under the hand and seal of office of the Judge^{Probate} of the County of Washington, came into my hands as Tax-collector of said Taxes in the said County aforesaid for the year A.D. 1851; and whereas certain lands lying in said county, were specified as the property of G. Goodwin, which assessment amounted to the sum of Forty-two and a half cents; and whereas after the coming of the said assessment into my hands, I, James K. Blount, Tax-collector in and for the county aforesaid, did seize and take the lands hereinafter particularly mentioned and described to pay and satisfy the Taxes due in said assessment, and expenses and fees; and first having given three months notice of the intention did sell the same, by advertisement, in the Mobile Advertiser a newspaper printed in the Town of Mobile in Mobile County Alabama, did offer the same at public vendue, to the highest bidder, at the door of the Courthouse of Washington County, according to the statute in such cases made and provided on the 8th day March A.D. 1852, between the hours of twelve o'clock A.M. and four o'clock of that day, and did sell the same to he being the highest bidder, and purchaser thereof, for the sum of Four dollars and ninety four cents.

Now know ye, that I, James K. Blount, Tax-collector as aforesaid, by virtue of the said certified assessment above mentioned, and the power in me vested by law, and in consideration of the sum of Four dollars and Ninety four cents, lawful money of the State of Alabama, to me in hand paid by the said William Donaldson the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted, bargained, sold and conveyed and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Wm. Donaldson and to his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns (subject to be redeemed at any time (by the owner) within two years from the date of the sale hereof) all the right, title and interest of the said G. Goodwin, and all the right, title, interest and estate of all and every other person or persons, either holding under the

said of Godwin or otherwise, in and to all those certain pieces, parcels or lots of land and premises, situate, lying and being in the County of Washington, and described as follows, to wit: Fractional section forty-three, Township Eight, Range One West; Containing One hundred acres more or less with all and singular the appurtenances therunto belonging, or in anywise appertaining, to have and hold the said land and premises to the said ~~John~~ Donaldson and to his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever, to his and their only proper use, benefit and behoof, as fully and completely as if the said James H. Blount, Tax-Collector of Washington County as aforesaid, may by virtue of the said appointment, and of the power and authority in me vested by law, to sell and convey the same.
