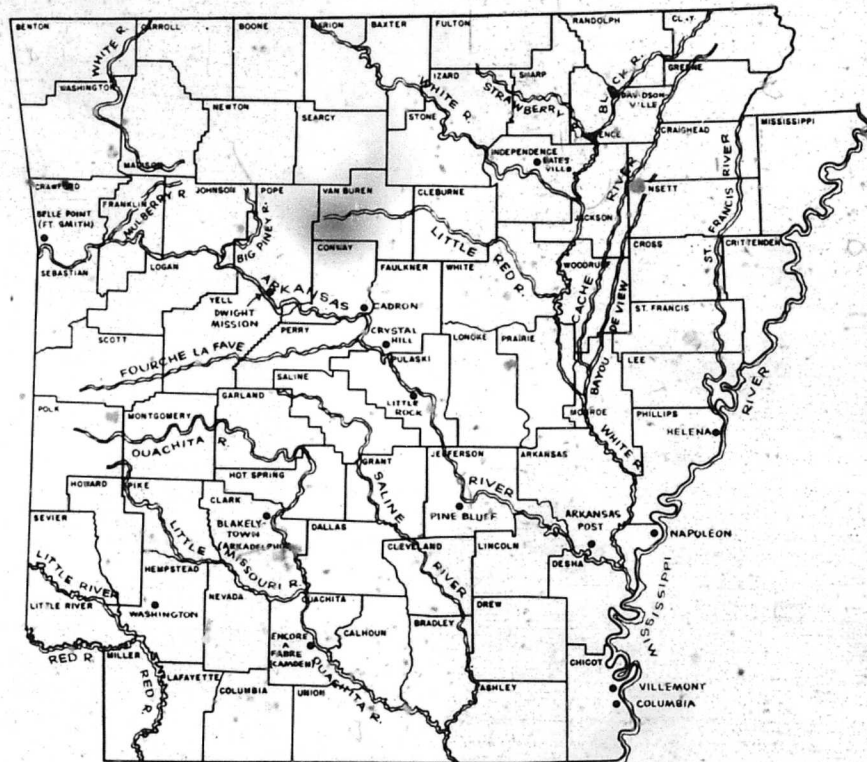

#### FROM THE EDITOR

The Arkansas Genealogical Research Aid was conceived in 1966 as a means of printing and distributing to the 39 Arkansas DAR Chapters, the Index to the DAR Arkansas volumes of unpublished records - which numbered 50 at that time. Volume I was published as a quarterly in four issues and the publication was suspended due to the heavy work load involved in the Editor's position as Arkansas State Chairman of Genealogical Records for the Arkansas Society, National Society, Daughters of the American Revolution from 1966 - 1969.

During this period, seventeen new volumes were added to our collection and as our work in the Genealogy Department increases, the need for this Index is even greater. It renders a service to the Chapters in Membership, as we search for records to complete the papers of prospective members, and in Genealogical Records, where a search of the Index prevents the duplication of material already sent in.

Although the Research Aid is not an official publication of the Arkansas Society, DAR, it is compiled for the primary purpose of aiding members of the organization in our work.

In addition to the Index to the DAR volumes, other genealogical material has been included that will benefit researchers in Arkansas records, especially those living out of state.

As we learn by experience we feel that some improvements in our format have been made. Beginning with Volume II, the main bulk of genealogical statistics will be combined in a large 'COMPENDIUM' which the subscribers to the Research Aid

will find in the back of each issue.

The 'COMPENDIUM', a large collection of Arkansas genealogical data, is a continuous project, and is being compiled as part of my contribution to the DAR during my lifetime. Other DAR members are also helping with this giant effort by indexing material, clipping and processing contemporary obituaries from Arkansas newspapers, etc.

Genealogical data of all types and dates are listed on 3 x 5 index cards and filed. At some future date, the data will be typed into volumes. Until that time the collection will remain in my care and a part of it will be published in the Research Aid in order to help as many researchers as possible.

Because of the nature of genealogical data included in the Research Aid and the Compendium, the Editor cannot assume any responsibility for errors or material submitted for these publications. We would, however, appreciate errors being called to our attention in order that they may be corrected.

## ARKANSAS RESEARCH

There are three main research areas in Little Rock - the Arkansas History Commission in the Old State House at Markham and Louisiana streets, the Genealogy Room in the Little Rock Public Library, Eighth and Louisiana streets - which also houses the DAR Library, and the Pulaski County Court House.

In this issue we will list the basic genealogical source materials in the Arkansas History Commission and the Little Rock Public Library. In later issues we will break these categories down into a detailed list - such as listing the year and counties for the tax records, etc. We will also include indexes for the records in the Pulaski County Court House.

As a researcher, working in Arkansas records, you may desire to have some of these references checked for your family names. You may write to the Arkansas History Commission for their list of researchers who do work at that facility and it will list their rates. Most of these researchers also work in the other two locations. Or, you may want to contact one of the DAR researchers whose names are listed in this issue. I am personally acquainted with these DAR genealogists and have worked with them for many years.

In the event that you are a 'do it yourself' researcher and want to order individual records or have one thing at a time looked up, this method will be explained further in this issue.

The Arkansas State land records are deposited in the State Capitol building. We now have an excellent DAR genealogist transcribing these records and publishing them. Details listed under 'Book Reviews'.

FACTS TO REMEMBER  
 WHEN RESEARCHING ARKANSAS RECORDS

Arkansas was first a part of the *Louisiana Territory*.

In 1805 Congress designated what is now Arkansas and the lower part of Missouri as the District of New Madrid. In 1806 the Legislature of the territory passed an act declaring the lower part of the District of New Madrid as the District of Arkansas.

In 1810 there were only 1,062 people living in Arkansas. The New Madrid earthquake in the upper part of Louisiana Territory in 1811 caused many families to move into Arkansas. In 1815 Congress passed a law allowing all persons who had lost their land 160 acres in the territory and issued them what was called 'New Madrid Certificates'.

In 1812 the *Missouri Territory* was formed and included Arkansas.

In 1819 Congress created the *Arkansas Territory*. There were about 14,000 people living in Arkansas at this time.

The first counties created were:

ARKANSAS	CRAWFORD	LAWRENCE
CHICOT	HEMPSTEAD	MILLER
CLARK	INDEPENDENCE	PHILLIPS

The territorial period lasted until 1836 when Arkansas was admitted to the Union as a state. There were somewhat over 50,000 people living in the State by this time.

The French were the first permanent settlers of Arkansas, and descendants of these people are still here. The first English speaking pioneers came into the State around 1807, and were mainly from Tennessee, Kentucky, Alabama, South Carolina and Georgia.

ARKANSAS CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS

*Stoop, Angels, hither from the skies!  
There is no holier spot of Ground  
Than where Defeated Valor lies,  
By mourning Beauty Crowned!*

Monument in the National Cemetery, Little Rock, Arkansas, erected by Memorial Chapter, United Daughters of the Confederacy, 1907.

There are reportedly 3,000 Confederate Soldiers and Sailors buried on land now included in the National Cemetery in Little Rock. They were buried on property that the Government wanted to purchase for a National Cemetery and part of the agreement was that these graves be allowed to remain. Three-fourths of the graves that contain markers are 'Unknown Confederate Soldiers'. Those that have names are listed in the Compendium.

\*\*\*

Over a rock wall from the National Cemetery in Little Rock is the large Oakland Cemetery, the second oldest in the city. Located in the very south-east corner of this cemetery is a Confederate Monument erected in 1913 which reads:

*'In Memory of nine hundred Confederate  
Soldiers buried within this enclosure  
- most of whom died in the hospitals  
in Little Rock, Arkansas, in 1863.'*

As far as can be determined, the hospital records containing the names of these soldiers have not been located and published. This is one of the projects we are working on as well as locating the registers of the Federal Prison in Little Rock where so many Confederates also died. When we do locate these records, the names will be published in the Research Aid.

REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIERS AND THEIR  
DESCENDANTS WHO CAME TO ARKANSAS

Lost in a small cemetery, located in a field, on the farm of Henry Pickmond near Van Buren, Crawford County, Arkansas, is the grave of what the DAR calls 'a Real Daughter'. The daughter of a Revolutionary War Soldier.

Her name was Sarah Smith, daughter of John Smith, Revolutionary War Soldier of Kentucky. From an old family Bible and fragments of a letter written to Sarah by a brother 132 years ago, perhaps David Smith, who remained in Kentucky, we learn a few facts about this Real Daughter and her family.

The Bible does not give the birthdate of Sarah Smith but does state that she married Cornelius Snider on May 3, 1817. There is no information indicating where they married nor when they came to Arkansas. The births of 11 children are listed in this Bible which is owned by Mrs. Inez Foster and her daughter, Virginia Foster, descendants of the Snider family, who live in Ft. Smith, Arkansas.

Lake Luamma is named for one of Sarah's daughters. The old Snider home burned a few years ago. The DAR has placed a marker in the Fairview Cemetery in Ft. Smith in honor of this Real Daughter. The children of Cornelius and Sarah Snider:

The following letter is written in beautiful handwriting and is addressed: Mr. and Mrs. Cornelius Snider, Crawford Co., Lewis Creek, Post Office Arkansas.

Hancock County, Kentucky, Sept. 23rd, 1839

Dear Brother and Sister. Under a since of my long neglected duty I take my pen to inform you that we are all well at this time, thanks be to God for his kind mercies, hoping these lines may find you all enjoying the like blessings. Tho I have been considerably complaining since last Spring, I have had about six weeks of fever and ague and have been bit by a hog in the hand that I could not use it for a long time. But I believe that I am heartier at present than I have been in two years.

We have had another fine daughter born the 26th day of July last, but have not named it yet. I have just returned from the State of Ohio, and Brother Joseph and family (faded) they are all well (faded) McDonalds house at the lower end of Joseph's lane?

It seems that the Lord is and has been visiting his people in this country to a very great degree. There has been upwards of 100 people baptised at Clover Port at two meetings. I can't tell all but amongst the rest was McGavock and wife and Thomas? (faded) of J.W. Flanigan and wife, P.C., and nearly all the town folks and I believe that your sister Mary's family have all professed religion at a Methodist meeting (faded) but John and he is under very deep concern for his soul (faded) a widow is married to Mr. James Cooper sometime since and were all well a few days (several lines gone) been considerable sickness in that part of the world.

And now my Dear Brother and Sister, I must come to the more melancholy discourse which I suppose you are not unapprised of as I know some of my neighbors have written to you

and this is the main reason that I have not written sooner - namely the Death of our aged Father, one who has assisted in obtaining the American Independence (faded) is enjoying Republican Government for above sixty years and have seen many sore trials with his few enjoyments. The loss of our Mother and Mother "Inlaw" and a wide scattering of all his children so that there were not two in one State. But I hope and do fully believe that he is gone where dissatisfaction and disappointments are no more. He departed this life on the 10th or 9th day of May at night after an illness of about 3 weeks (faded) appeared to be something like colick which would rise and appear to settle about his heart for a few minutes then he would be quite easy, but failed in strength daily till he died. I do not recollect of ever seeing any person in their proper mind as he was that were so much resigned to the will of Heaven as he was, and when he died I have no idea that he ever awoke out of sleep or moved one limb of his body. I feel happy in our Father's Death tho I am sorry for the loss as he was great company to me, but we will try to put off excessive grief. As to the settling of his temporal concerns, he left written (faded) which Capt. Hale and son Thomas and my (balance of letter faded out)

On another page, in the handwriting of John Smith - What I intend to do if I have the chance, the little property or money the Lord has blest me with and if I can't establish it according to law they can see this my handwriting which I, knowing it to be my will, they will agree with one another and the Lord Bless them all for I know that I love them. John Smith May 8th, 1839. (Note: He mentions his children Elizabeth Frick, Rachel Kirk, Sarah Snider, David and Joseph Smith. There could have been others listed in the faded and missing lines.)
