DANIEL ALLEN, the first in America, came from Scotland in the 16th century, and settled in Virginia.

JAMES ALLEN, son of Daniel, who married an Anderson, lived and died in the county of Hanover, Virginia.

DANIEL ALLEN, son of James, was born in county Hanover, Va., 12th of September, 1728; died in the county of Cumberland, 1807. His first wife was a Harrison, by whom he had ten children, to-wit:

Moses, who died on board a prison ship, in Charleston, as a prisoner of the Revolutionary War;

Frances, who died in the 18th year of her age;

Priscilla, who married a Wilson, left three sons and daughters;

Benjamin, who married a Hill, left two sons and four daughters;

Elizabeth, who married a Smith, left two sons and four daughters;

Anna, who married an Anderson, left two sons and three daughters;

Anne, who first married Warson, after his death married Claybrook, and died without issue;

Cary, who married a Fleming, left one child, who died an infant in Kentucky;

Sarah, who married a Snoddy, left three sons and one daughter;

Patsy, who married a Smith, left no issue.

After the death of Daniel Allen's first wife, he married the widow of Joseph Hill, who was Johanna Read, the daughter of William Read, of Bedford county, Virginia, whose mother descended from Pocahontas.

Johanna had by her first husband, Joseph Hill, three sons and two daughters to-wit: Thomas, William, Elizabeth, Joicy and Joseph.

Daniel Allen had by his first wife, Johanna, two daughters and one son, viz:

Zellah, who married Perrick, left four sons and four daughters;

Lolly, who married a Smith, left four sons and six daughters;

Daniel A., who married Lucy Watts.

Daniel Anderson Allen, son of Daniel, was born in Cumberland county, Va., 16th March, 1782, and died.

Lucy Watts, (daughter of William Watts, whose wife was a Wood), was born in Madison county, Va., on the 30th of August, 1782, and died in Cass county, Ga., on the 14th day of December, 1849.

Daniel A. Allen and Lucy Watts were married on the 8th September, 1803, and left issue as follows:

William W., was born 4th July, 1806; married Lucy Carrington.

## MORRIS

Taken from the private papers of Mrs. C. A. Palmer, 825 S. E. 2nd Avenue, Gainesville, Florida. Written by Mrs. Charles Henry Clark, Albia, Iowa,

"Thomas Morris was born east of the mountains in Pennsylvania. He was of Scotch descent. He married Mary Benward who was of French descent, and her brother married a sister of Thomas. They with their brother Ben Morris and cousin Uriah John Morris moved to the west part of Pennsylvania. Thomas settled in Beaver County. David Benward married Thomas' sister Tacy. They settled in Virginia.

"Thomas had a family of ten children. Tacy was named for her Aunt Tacy Benward. David for his uncle David Benward. John was named for John Rosebury who married a sister of Thomas and lived in Indiana. Uriah Butler Morris was named for his cousin Uriah Morris who died in or near Russell, Lucas County, Iowa. George was named for an old Presbyterian minister. Levi was named for his Uncle Levi Hopkins who married another sister of Thomas Morris. Levi Morris went to school, was clerk or recorder in the court house in Ohio or Indiana. He died of hemorrhage of the lungs in Columbus. Mary Morris was named for her mother. Jane was next. She lived with Uriah Morris awhile after he moved to Lucas County, Iowa. Eliza Morris was the youngest. She says, "I remember your father, Uriah, teaching school in Virginia. He and I boarded at Uncle David Benward's. He was a brother of our mother, but after Uriah went away I never saw any of them but George. I came from Pennsylvania with George in 1845. I kept house for him until he sold his farm then I came to Spring Valley in 1859. I was married to Joseph Kellog, September 11, 1860. He built a house on his land and in December of the same year we came to our own house. There I have been ever since. We raised our family of seven children." The above was written by Mrs. Charles Henry Clark, Albia, Iowa, and taken from a letter written to her by Mrs. Joseph Kellog, Spring Valley, Minnesota.

# WILLIAM TONG

Taken from the private papers of Mrs. Albert Vidal, 1026 S. W. 2nd Avenue, Gainesville, Florida. Copied February 26, 1955.

William Tong, father or grandfather (?) of William Tong who emigrated to America and settled near Upper Marlboro, Md. was born near Manchester, England in 1662, and died in 1727. His father was a near relative of Robert Mort of Warton Hall, where he is buried. His mother was early left a widow with three children, and was aided by Mort, who probably supplied the funds for the education of the son William. William Tong began his studies with a view to the law, but his mother's influence turned him to the ministry, and he became a noted Presbyterian clergyman.

He entered the Academy of Richard Frankland, then at Naland, and became Frankland's most distinguished student. Early in 1685 he was licensed to preach, and for two years was chaplain in Shropshire and Boreatton. He soon became known as a non-conformist, but until threatened with prosecution he preached at the Chapel of Cockshut, Shopshire.

In March 1681, he took a three months engagement at Chester. His services were conducted at noon and at night in the home of Anthony Henthouse, and were so successful that they were soon transferred to a large building that was a part of the Friary. The Dean of Chester urged him to conform, but he could not influence him. From Chester he was called to be the first pastor of a newly formed dissenting congregation at Kentsford, Cheshire. He procured the building of the meeting house in Brook street, which was opened in 1688.



Later he became co-pastor with Thomas Shewell, at the great meeting house in Coventry, where he had great success for thirteen years. He escaped the prosecutions which fell upon Oldfield, tho he assisted him in academy teaching. The bursaries of the Presbyterian funds were paid through him. His forte was preaching, and he laid the foundations of several dissenting congregations.

On the death of Nathaniel Taylor, Tong was elected pastor of Salters Hall Court, Cannon Street, London. John Newman was retained as assistant. The congregation was large, and the most wealthy among the London dissenters. Tong was soon elected to succeed John Howe as one of the four preachers of the merchants lecture course on Tuesday mornings at Salters Hall.

He took a prominent part in the controversy arising out of the alleged heresies of James Prince of Exeter. As one of the original trustees of the <sup>fund</sup> foundation of Daniel Williams DD., Tong had a share in the intricate task of carrying these benefactions into effect. He was also one of the first distributors of the English regium donum, and a trustee of the Barnes bequest.

It is said by his biographer that, "He was a man of unselfish purpose, free from sectarian feeling, courted for his social attainments and his character, and always open handed to the needy."

His portrait by Wollaston was engraved by Simon. His most important works are contributions to non-conformist history. He died in March, 1727, and his funeral was preached by John Newman.

\*\*\*\*

The founder of the Tong family in America, came to this country about the year of 1740, and settled in Maryland in Prince George county. A record of the deeds to his farm on Piscatawa Creek, is filed in the court house at Upper Marleboro', the county seat. I have been unable to find any data of the family history of this first American Tong, but he had a son, William, who was born August 9th, 1756.

William Tong who was born August 9th, 1756, lived in Prince George County, Maryland. He was a planter and soldier. He fought through the Revolutionary war in an Independent company known as the Maryland Flying Camp, of which Rizen Beall was Captain. He fought in the battles of Germantown and Brandywine.
