

In the name of God. Amen. I Jacob T. Goodbread of the County of Columbia in the State of Florida, being in good health of body and of sound and disposing mind & memory, and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs. Whilst I have strength and capacity do make and publish this my last will and testament: hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made,

and first aforementioned, I commit my soul into the hands of my Creator, who gave it and my body to the earth from which it sprung - and as to such worldly Estate with which it has pleased God to entrust me, I dispose of the same as follows;

Imprimero, I desire that all my just & honest debts should be paid by my Executors hereinafter mentioned -

Item- I give and bequeath unto my son Philip Goodbread the following three negroes- Henry, aged 19 years - Mary aged 22 years and Eliza, aged 2 years, for and during the term of his natural life - and after his death then to his child or children and their heirs forever - but if the said Philip should die without a child or children then it is my will & desire that said negroes should revert to my Estate and become part and parcel thereof. To my other children I give and bequeath the following negroes, in the same manner, on the same conditions and with the same restrictions that I have bequeathed the above. to my son Philip- to wit: To my daughter America Brown Aaron aged 25 years and Clementine aged 17 years -

To my daughter Fammelia Goodbread, Daniel age 20 years and Ellen aged 12 years, to be delivered to her when she becomes of age or marries. --

To my daughter Elizabeth B. Goodbread, Prince aged 15 years and Seaby aged 13 years, to be delivered to her when she becomes of age or marries.

To my son Jacob T. Goodbread, Timothy aged 14 years and Hier aged 10 years, to be delivered to him when he becomes of age or marries --

To my daughter Missouri I Goodbread, Joseph aged 12 years and Zasy aged 7 years, to be delivered to her when she becomes of age or marries --

To My daughter Georgia T Goodbread, Thomas aged 10 years and Alfaretta aged 4 years - to be delivered to her when she becomes of age or marries.

To my Son Augustine S. Goodbread, Toney aged 8 years and Mary aged 2 years, to be delivered to him when he becomes of age or marries.

To my daughter Kansas Goodbread, David aged 9 years and Mary aged 2 years to be delivered to her when she becomes of age or marries--

It is furthermore my will & desire that my minor children should always and in every event be supported, educated & maintained out of the Estate in the hands of my Executors without any charge on the property hereinbefore specifically given them, until they either become of age or marry, at which time their negroes are to be delivered to them, and if any or either of said negroes should die or become from any cause valueless or depreciated in value at any time before the delivery of the same to their respective Legatees it is my will the death or deficiency in value of such negro or negroes shall be a charge on my general Estate and I hereby instruct and enjoin my Executors to acknowledge and pay the same either by replacing another negro or negroes in his or their stead or by making up the deficiency in money.

The residue and remainder of all my estate both real and personal not herein otherwise disposed of, I give and grant unto my beloved wife Jane Goodbread, for & during the term of her natural life - and after her death, it is my will & desire that the property should be kept together until the marriage of the youngest child and at such marriage, I desire (inasmuch as I have allowed my son Philip Goodbread and my daughter America Brown, the use and benefit of the negroes hereinbefore granted them for years past) that the sum of five hundred dollars should be paid to each one of my other children; and in the case of the death of any one or more of them, leaving a child or children then that such child or children shall be entitled to & receive the same sum to which the deceased parent would have been entitled under the bequest herein made - and after these sums are respectively paid out, then it is my will that the balance should be equally

divided amongst all of my children or their representatives according to the provisions of the statutes of Descents & Distributives now of force in the State of Florida and finally I appoint & constitute my beloved wife Jane Goodbread and Son Philip Executors of this my last will & testament and guardians of my minor children--

Codicil first

I Jacob T. Goodbread of Columbia County State of Florida--being of disposing mind and memory do hereby constitute this a codicil to my last Will and Testament. Item First I will that my Son Thomas D. Goodbread by my second wife "Nancy" H. Goodbread and should I have an other heir by her also that heir if any shall have all the rights and privileges of the children by my first wife Jane D. Goodbread.

Item Second It is my will that at my death all the property belonging to my second wife at the time of her marriage shall revert to her in full for her to dispose of at her will and pleasure.

Item Third I hereby appoint Philip Goodbread - Guardian for my son Thomas D. Goodbread and any other heir that I have by my wife Nancy H. Goodbread.

Item Fourth I hereby appoint in addition to the Executors made in my last Will and Testament to which this is a Codicil, John V. Brown as one of my Executors.
