#### DEATH OF C.H. BLOCKER OF PINELLAS COUNTY IN SOUTH CAROLINA, 1911

#### FLORIDA MAN KILLED BY A TRAIN

Charleston, S.C., March 28 -- C.H. Blocker, about fifty years old, of St. Petersburg, Fla., was run over and instantly killed by Train Number 86, the northbound Atlantic Coast Line Palmetto Limited, as it was pulling in at the Union Passenger Station at Florence tonight. Mr. Blocker was a passenger on the train by which he was killed, having stepped off the platform of a coach, after having been told by the train crew, it is said, not to do so until the train stopped.

Mr. Blocker, aged 69, was the father of Mayor A. Blocker, and J.C. Blocker, a prominent real estate operator both of St. Petersburg.
