Blocker, about fif years old, of St. Petersburg, Fla., was run over a instantly killed by Train Number 86, the northbound Atlant Coast Line Palmetto Limited, as it was pulling in at t Union Passenger Station at Florence tonight. Mr. Blocker was passenger on the train by which he was killed, havi stepped off the platform of a coach, after having been to by the train crew, it is said, not to do so until the trastopped.

Mr. Blocker, aged 69, was the father of Mayor A. Blocker, and J.C. Blocker, a prominent real estate operatoboth of St. Petersburg.
