

CHURCH OF THE ASCENSION BURYING GROUND

at West New Brighton.

General Remarks.

Plate 2 shows the approximate outline of the church land, though the map contains a number of errors. The outline of the Staten Island Cemetery is incorrect; see Plate 3 for correct outline. The rear line of the Staten Island Cemetery should be 148.8 feet, not 48.8. The building shown in the rear of the Church of the Ascension is not Trinity Chapel, but the Parish House, erected in 1902. What remains of the burying ground lies between the church and the east line of the Staten Island Cemetery; a general view of the ground west of the church is shown in Plate 3. The frontispiece of this volume portrays Trinity Chapel, prior to 1870, when it was moved back to make way for the Church of the Ascension. Observe that grave-stones appear on the east side of Trinity Chapel. The 1898 picture shows no gravestones north of the great tree. The stones on the east side of Trinity Chapel were undoubtedly removed many years ago. Comparison of the 1898 photograph with the gravestones as they stand at present reveals that the following gravestones were transferred in 1902, when the Parish House was built:

Row west of the church,	Nos. 413 to 424,
1st, 2nd and 3rd Rows,	Nos. 425 to 459,
4th Row, including	Nos. 463 to 473,
5th Row, including	Nos. 474 to 478, 482 to 484.

The transcript now presented cannot be expected to show the gravestones in the same contiguous positions that they occupied when first erected. At least the stones cited above have been transferred and probably all those close to the church (Nos. 397 to 412). To illustrate how carelessly the transfer was made, an example may be cited: Footstone No. 405, by its distinctive shape and lettering, without doubt belongs to gravestone No. 428. The transcript begins with the gravestones close to the walls of the church, all lying flat. The soil is very sandy and the flat stones form a convenient channel to protect the soil from the water which pours off the slanting roof in heavy rains. The action of the water appears to have kept these gravestones in better condition than those standing upright. Unfortunately tar or roof cement also drips from the roof; and this has not improved the appearance of some of the white marble stones. However, no great damage has been done, because tar is an excellent preservative.

The reader is again cautioned to remember that the cardinal points of the compass are used exclusively in describing the positions of the gravestones. That is to say, it is assumed that the Church of the Ascension faces due north and that all the rows of gravestones run either east and west or north and south.

On west side of church, forming a gutter against the west wall and running from north to south. All stones are flat. No. 397 is in the corner behind the tower. Nos. 398 to 406 form a paved plot in the corner north of the wing.

ginning of the 6th row. It is probably the gravestone of Jeremiah Smith.
Five feet farther south from it is the footstone, marked "J. S." and fac-
ing west; this was also removed at the same time as the headstone. A
portion of the verse remains on the base of the headstone, viz.
From suffering and from sin
And freed from ev'ry care.

THE STATEN ISLAND CEMETERY

at West New Brighton.

General Remarks

Plate 3 is a photograph of the official map of the cemetery, filed in the County Clerk's office on Dec. 4, 1861, and indexed as Map 83, Cemetery at Castleton on the North Shore; the surveyor was John J. Clute. The Staten Island Cemetery was owned by Lot C. Clark, who acquired the title to the land in 1847. The cemetery was probably opened in 1851. The first deeds for cemetery lots recorded in the County Clerk's office were dated August 20, 1861. The map leaves little to be said in the way of a introduction. The gravestones in each lot are transcribed in order (as far as possible) from left to right. Unless particularly noted, the gravestones of East Avenue face west, and gravestones on the east side face east. Reference should be made to the map for the general descriptions and the locations of the lots. Some of the front part of the cemetery is shown in the foreground of the 1890 view of the Church of the Ascension; see Plate 13. Another view farther back appears in the foreground of the photograph of the Parish House, in Plate 12.

EAST AVENUE, easterly side, Lots 166-163, copied by C. W. L.

North of Lot 166, in the space marked on the map "unoccupied" a lot has been set aside for Post 524 G. A. R. There appear to be over a dozen interments in the plot, but according to Mr. Cuddey, caretaker of the Cemetery, only two or three veterans are buried there, the other markers being for decorative purposes. There is a tall flagpole in the lot.

END OF THE STATEN ISLAND CEMETERY.

THE FOUNTAIN CEMETERY, at West New Brighton.

General Remarks.

Plates 2 and 4 show maps of the cemetery. The official map has been
lost from the County Clerk's office; it was filed May 14, 1870 and indexed
as Map 276. Plate 4 is a photograph of a map loaned by Treadwell Steers,
the undertaker. The land occupied by the cemetery was in the possession
of Henry Fountain for many years before the cemetery was opened. It is
probable that there was some overflow of interments from the rear of Trin-
ity Chapel Burying Ground and that a few lots were occupied before plans
were drawn and a survey made for the cemetery proper. Henry Fountain died
May 28, 1863, leaving as heirs his children, Vincent Fountain, Mary L. wife
of William Christopher, Jane wife of Paul Hersebaum, Susan wife of John La-
forge, and Emma Ann wife of Samuel Bayley, all of adult age. The Fountain
Cemetery was probably formally opened in the year 1866. The first deeds
for cemetery lots from the heirs of Henry Fountain recorded in the County
Clerk's office were dated January 1, 1866. The Fountain Cemetery Associa-
tion was incorporated June 25, 1874. The names which show faintly upon
the lots in Plate 4 appear in pencil upon the map and undoubtedly are the
names of the lot owners. By reference to Plate 2, it will be noticed that
an eastern section of the cemetery is not shown upon the first map. This
section contains single graves. Lots Nos. 162 and 163 are reserved for the
entrance to the cemetery. There are two lots numbered 122 on the map. The
numbers of the lots are sufficient guides to the reader the manner of
transcription. As a general rule, whenever feasible the lots were
transcribed from left to right, the same as the customary plan applied to
the gravestones. The gravestones face towards the front of the lots, un-
less otherwise noted.
