

THE FOUNTAIN CEMETERY, at West New Brighton.

General Remarks.

Plates 2 and 4 show maps of the cemetery. The official map has been lost from the County Clerk's office; it was filed May 14, 1870 and indexed as Map 276. Plate 4 is a photograph of a map loaned by Treadwell Steers, the undertaker. The land occupied by the cemetery was in the possession of Henry Fountain for many years before the cemetery was opened. It is probable that there was some overflow of interments from the rear of Trinity Chapel Burying Ground and that a few lots were occupied before plans were drawn and a survey made for the cemetery proper. Henry Fountain died May 28, 1863, leaving as heirs his children, Vincent Fountain, Mary L. wife of Samuel Christopher, Jane wife of Paul Herobreen, Susan wife of John La Forge, and Emma Ann wife of Samuel Bayley, all of adult age. The Fountain Cemetery was probably formally opened in the year 1866. The first deeds for cemetery lots from the heirs of Henry Fountain recorded in the County Clerk's office were dated January 1, 1866. The Fountain Cemetery Association was incorporated June 28, 1874. The names which show faintly upon the lots in Plate 4 appear in pencil upon the map and undoubtedly are the names of the lot owners. By reference to Plate 2, it will be noticed that an eastern section of the cemetery is not shown upon the first map. This section contains single graves. Lots Nos. 162 and 163 are reserved for the entrance to the cemetery. There are two lots numbered 172 on the map. The numbers of the lots are sufficient guides to indicate to the reader the manner of transcription. As a general rule, whenever feasible the lots were transcribed from left to right, the same as the customary plan applied to the grave-stones. The grave-stones face towards the front of the lots, unless otherwise noted.

General Remarks.

This is the newer part of the Cemetery, which was opened in 1892. The older part occupies pages 33 to 51. Mr. Davis transcribed all the inscriptions taken in this part of the cemetery. The gravestones and lots were copied in rows running from south to north (left to right); unless otherwise noted, the gravestones and monuments face east towards Richmond Avenue. The majority of the monuments in the newer part of the cemetery are granite. Nos. 1501 to 1510 comprise four rows in the large plot evidently laid out for single graves and east of lots 1 to 4 inclusive. No. 1510 is a few feet east of lot 4 in the north-west corner of the plot; and No. 1501 is in the south-east corner, close to the entrance to the cemetery.
