

REVOLUTIONARY PENSIONS APPROVED

COHICK, Daniel. Soldier of the Revolution in Penna Line, sheweth Dec 22, 1824 that he was granted pension of \$40 per annum . . . John Fleming named his gdn to receive & apply the gratuity. Feb term, 1825

ENGLISH, James, On recommendation of the Board for relief of disabled, aged & poor, Revolutionary officers & soldiers at Harrisburg. . the court apptd Wm Gallagher to receive & expend the pension of \$40 per annum of James English, Lycoming Co. 1.28.1813. Book A-p 11

CAPTAIN THOMAS KEMPLAIN, dec'd. The widow Mary Campleton petitions for support for herself & children of which she has SIX. . . Book A, pg 11

Pg 46: Captain Thomas Kemplain, soldier of the Revolution. On petition of Mary Kemple, widow of Thos Kemple, who was killed in the service of the United States in the Revolutionary War. . court did grant her a pension in pursuance of Act of Assembly for relief of widows & children of Officers & Privates who lost their lives in the Rev. War. . pension to be paid at rate of \$28 per month annually. (Notations show payments made through 1813).

Deed Bk C-3, pg 93: ROBERT KEMPLAIN of Lycoming Twp, yeoman, . . his deed to James Greer of Chester Co, Pa yeoman, tract land by patent 5.22.1798 had been granted by Commonwealth of Pa to Mary Kemplain, widow of Thomas Kemplain. . (herein described) this time heirs of Mary are named as: Robert, eldest son; Rebecca, wife Wm Greer; Thomas; Isabella; & Mary wife of Robert Greer. . sold to James Greer 11.27.1798. Recorded 6.6.1799.
