It would seem that almost all the fertile lands were occupied so much so that many are complaining of want of room, and have started on the far side to seek their new homes. It is a well watered country - all the streams remarkable for their clearness. I have been informed by the oldest inhabitants that no people have been healthier until the present summer, when a very fatal disease (probably Typhoid fever) made its appearance, and has caused much distress. No legends coming to us from older times, are related here nothing particularly attractive in nature or in art.

Remarks: These two districts are generally hills, and are very rich and productive, and is also as fertile as any portion of Middle Tennessee. The Society is as good as can be found in any County. The price of Land in these districts have advanced in the last five years from one or two dollars per acre to \$50 per acre. There is a large Cotton Mill situated in the immediate vicinity of Palatka, which is now about being completed, to be run by Steam. Which probably will give employment to some sixty or eighty persons. There has been no epidemic of disease or epidemic raging in our midst to cause distress amongst our inhabitants. Nothing like mineral or mines in either of these districts have as yet been discovered.

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Remarks: This District has in General a healthful Climate, and a Rich Fertile Soil, and a diversified Surface. The Lands are very Rich and productive, the people generally, intelligent and enterprising. A portion of this District is owned by wealthy people, and will command a high price, being rated so high that several persons who own several tracts, and have large families are compelled to sell their Lands and move. The want of Rain, some of whom have already gone to the Fair met, and the pleasure of coming. I am an old Revolutionary Soldier by the name of Palmer, who has since died. He informed me that he was wounded on the 27 day of May last and served in and at the battle of Red Bank, also at Big Horn Court House and at many other places.

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Remarks: A Large portion of this District is still unsettled it is generally very poor and broken except on the various streams, which is very productive and is composed of a black and gravelly soil. It is an extremely healthy section of Country and is principally settled by poor people. The water is very clear and on a good many of the ~~streams~~ streams which flow through the District is to be found several very excellent sites for the location of cotton mills or other kinds of machinery.

Remarks: This district is thickly settled and about one half is cleared up and in cultivation, and the lands on the Creative Branches seem to be very much more in place than the fact that it has been planted in cotton so long that it tends to be seeded or clayed, there is a good deal of this district every Hardy Woodland and in some portions of it timber is very scarce. The people here generally seem very healthy, although there has been more deaths in it in the last year in proportion to its size than any other district that I have visited the water in Gumby Lim Stone Port is generally very good.
