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INSTRUCTIONS

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Enter the name of the primary disease in all eases, and where the immediate cause of death has been a complication or consequence of the primary disease, enter that also. For instance, enter all cases of death-resulting either immediately or remotely from measles, scarlet fever, typhoid fever, remittent fever, small pox, &c., under the names of those diseases, but add also drapsy, hemorrhage from the bowels, pneumonia, &c., if these occurred as complications and were the more immediate cause of death. In cases of death from hemorrhage, specify the origin of the hemorrhage, thus: hemorrhage from aortic aneurism, hemorrhage from ulcer of intestines in typhoid fever, hemorrhage from lungs, hemorrhage from wound of neck, &c. These should, as far as possible, be reported under special heads.
