Obituary - John R. Black, Pioneer Citizen Dies.

"Death removed one of our most highly respected citizens Friday, March 28, when Mr. John R. Black answered the call, in the 83'rd year of his age.

Deceased was born and reared in Hardeman County near Toone, where, in his younger days he taught school at Cloverport and Black's Academy. He later graduated from the University of Tennessee.

In 1880 he was married to Miss. Georgia Campbell, who with two children, Miss. Lucy Black, teacher at Cleveland, Miss., and Mrs. J. E. Miller, of Huntsville, Mla., also two grandchildren, Eldred and John Robert Miller survive.

Mr. Black was one of the outstanding citizens of the County, notes for his enegry, honesty and industry. For 53 years he has followed farming successfully and scientifically:

He was ex-president of the Farm Bureau, and served the county in many different capacities as Magistrate, school director and in other positions always creditably.

He was a member of the cumberland Presbyterian Church, serving as elder for over forty years, also was a member of the Masonic Lodge.
