Campbell family (George Washington
Campbell, 1769-1848)

Owner and donor: Unknown

Feb. 4. 1885.

The original manuscript book of Dr. Archt Campbell, referred to on the next page, is still in the possession of my Cousin George W. Campbell. From it, I make the following corrections & additions to the menu.

1. There is recorded the birth of a tenth child - name & date of birth illegible - baptised by Mr. McKenzie. Do my grandfather was next to the youngest - not the youngest, Mr. J. B. Franklin of City of New York, tells me (1829/30) his brother died in 1781 at New York - aged 59 yrs.

2. The date of Alexander's death is not given. It was before Sept. 1780 - & the date 21st Sept. 1780, belongs to the death of Donald, killed by John King & his party.

3. Colin Campbell, grand father of Geo. W. & M.C., married Jane Hogston in Rowan Co. N.C. Dec. 3^d 1783. Their first four children were born dead - the first living child was born at the Island Fort, Catawba River, Iredell Co. N.C., 17th Sept. 1788 & baptised Agnes. She died 1793.

First son, Archibald Angus born 31 Aug. 1792 - father of W. & M.C.

4. Archibald & Colin Campbell died Dec. 23rd 1834. His wife had died on 6th June 1831.

In the spring of 1872, I found the binding of this Bible so worn and the record kept in it so rough and defaced by frequent use that I had the book rebound and three new leaves inserted, on which I now copy from the original pages all the record that remained.

George Campbell Brown.

Benjamin Stoddert and Rebecca Loundes were married, the seventh day of June in the year of our Lord, one thousand, seven hundred and eighty-one.

Benjamin Forrest Stoddert, son of Benjamin and Rebecca Stoddert, was born the thirteenth of May, in the year, one thousand, seven hundred and eighty-two.

(He died in 1834) is written in pencil after the above entry.

Elizabeth Stoddert, daughter of Benjamin and Rebecca Stoddert, was born the second of September in the year, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-four.

Thomas Stoddert, son of Benjamin and Rebecca Stoddert, was born the fifth of January 1787 - and died the 15th April 1788.

> Christopher Stoddert, son of Benjamin and Rebecca Stoddert, was born the 17th November 1799 in Philadelphia; and died the 13th September 1821 - at York Haven in Pennsylvania.

Rebecca Stoddert, wife of Benjamin Stoddert, departed this life the 10th February, 1802 -

Elizabeth Stoddert was married to Doctor Thos. Earle, the 3rd of March, 1807.

Rebecca Earle, daughter of Doctor Thos. Earle and Elizabeth, his wife, was born the 3rd Dec; 1808.

(The following entry was on a small scrap & should come just above that of Christopher Stoddert, above)

Richard Stoddert, son of Benjamin and Rebecca Stoddert was born the 9th day of May 1793. - Died the 10th day of October, 1810.

Benjamin Stoddert, late Secretary of the Navy of the United States, departed this life on the 18th day of December in the year 1813, at

Bladensburg.

Christophe Stoddert, son of Benjamin Stoddert, died on the 13th September in the year 1821, at York-haven in the State of Pennsylvania.

Harriet Stoddert was born 12th April, 1789, in Georgetown.

William Stoddert was born Sept. 1786, Married 7 July, 1830, died 14th January, 1839.

Rebecca Stoddert was born July 1, 1798.

Copy of a Memorandum of the ages of the children of Archibald Campbell, forming a page in a manuscript book, the greater part of which consists of an outline of medical and surgical science.

My first child, Alexander, was born at Achonval 27th February, 1752
Baptized by Mr. Skelby.

Realaid, 7th Sept. 1753. My second child was born, ^{Jane} baptised by Mr. Ross.
18th July, 1755. Then the third child was born, Katherine, baptised by Mr. Job Munro
Realaid, 2nd Sept. 1757. My fourth child was born, Helen. Baptised by Mr. W. Ross.

Realaid 26 Sept. 1759. My fifth child was born, David. Baptised by Mr. W. Ross.

Realaid, on 12th April, 1761. My sixth child was born. Baptised Duncan, by Mr. Jas. R.

Realaid, on 12th April, 1763. Then my seventh child and fifth son was born,
Baptised John, by Mr. John M'Kay.

Determine, 1765, Oct. 26. Then my 8th Baner and third daughter was born, and
Baptised Elizabeth, by Mr. Geo. Munro.

Determine, Janry 24th (Saturday) 1767, ten early in the morning my ninth Baner
and fourth daughter was born. Baptised Anne by Mr. Jas. M'Kay.

8th Feb. 1769. Then George was born, Baptised by Mr. Mr. McGregor.

(1st child)

Alexander, the eldest, Christian and gentleman, died 21st Sept. 1780.
Then my David was shot dead thro' the head by a party under John King,
etc., at the Waxelaw.

Doctor Archibald Campbell deceased 7 April 1782, at his own house on
Crooked Creek, W. Kentuckey County, N.C.

Duncan dies in Kentucky, early in May, 1811.

George W. Campbell was married to Harriet Stoddert, second
daughter of Benjamin Stoddert, late secretary of the Navy of the U.S.
States, at Bladensburg, on the 18th day of July in the year, one thousand,
eight hundred and twelve (1812).

1. George Washington Campbell, first son of George W. and Harriet Campbell, was born on
Wednesday morning at three o'clock, the 1st day of September, in the year 1813,
in Georgetown District of Columbia, and died at St. Petersburg on the 12th April
1819, aged 5 years, 7 months & 12 days.

2. Benjamin Stoddert Campbell, second son of George W. and Harriet Campbell,
was born on Sunday morning at 11 o'clock, the 1st January, 1815, at Nashville - and
died at St. Petersburg in Russia on the 10th day of April, 1819.

3. Elizabeth McKay Campbell, first daughter of George W. and Harriet Campbell
was born on Friday, the 18th October, 1816, at Nashville - and died at
St. Petersburg in Russia, on the 19th day of April, 1819.

4. George Washington Campbell, third son of George W. and Harriet Campbell,
was born on Thursday morning at $\frac{1}{2}$ past 10 o'clock, the first (1st) day of
October in the year 1818 - at St. Petersburg in Russia.

Note. George W. Campbell, who was born as above on the first of Octo-
ber in the year 1818, was first christened, at St. Petersburg, Archibald
Monroe Campbell - and was again, on his arrival in the U. States,
christened, at Washington City, after his brother of the same name,
George W. Campbell, on the date of Nov 8th 1820.

5. Elizabeth McKay Campbell, second daughter of George W. and Harriet
Campbell, was born at St. Petersburg, Russia, on the 24th day of February
(Thursday), about $\frac{1}{2}$ past 1 o'clock P.M. - 1820.

6. On the 12th April, 1822, at Nashville, was born the sixth child and
fourth son of George W. and Harriet Campbell, called while he lived
Benjamin Stoddert (for his deceased brother); and died on the 20th
September of the same year (1822).

On the 25 April 1839, at Nashville, Elizabeth, alias Lydia, Mr.
Campbell, daughter of George W. and Harriet Campbell was married in
wedlock to James Percy Brown, Esq., son of the late Dr. Samuel Brown.

James Percy Brown departed this life at Nashville on the 2^d

day of April 1844, in his 63rd year.

George W. Campbell departed this life at ten o'clock in the afternoon of the 17th day of February in the year of our Lord, 1845, at Nashville, Tennessee. He was born in the Parish of Tongue and Shire of Hertfordshire, England, on 8th February 1789.

Harriet Campbell, widow of George W. Campbell, died of cholera at Guyandotter, Virginia, at one o'clock in the morning of the 17th July in the year 1849.

George W. Campbell, only surviving son of George W. and Harriet Campbell, died at Rochefort, France, the 8th of August, 1853.

George Campbell Brown, son of Jas. Percy and Liza Ko Campbell Brown was born at Nashville, on the 27th November, 1840.

Percy Brown, second son of Jas. Percy and Liza Ko C. Brown, was born at Nashville, 3rd March, 1843.

Harriet Stoddert Brown, daughter of Jas. P. and Liza Ko C. Brown, was born on the Cumberland Mountain at Mr. Wyatt's near Bon Air Springs, 1st August, 1844.

Percy Brown departed his life at 25 minutes after 8 o'clock, A.M., on the 25th day of June, 1853.

On the 23rd May 1863, Lieut. Genl Richard S. Ewell (C. S. Army) was married to Liza Ko C. Brown (daughter of George W. and H. Campbell) in Richmond, Virginia.

On the 10th October 1865, Harriet Stoddert Brown was married to Thomas J. Turner, in Baltimore, Md.

On the 11th Sept. 1866, (George) Campbell Brown was married to Sarah Rebecca Polk, at the residence of her Father, Genl Lucius J. Polk, in Maury County, Tenn.

Liza Ko Campbell Turner, first daughter of Thomas J. and Harriet J. Turner, was born at St. Louis, Mo., on the 15th Nov. 1866.

Lucius Polk Brown, first child of Campbell and Susan R.

Brown was born at his Uncle Polk's place in Maury County on the 1st August, 1867.

Julia Maffitt Turner second daughter of Thos. J. and Harriet J. Turner, was born at her Father's place, Marietta, St. Louis Co., Mo., on the 28th June 1868.

Richard Ewell Brown second son of Campbell and Susan P. Brown was born in Nashville, 12th January, 1870.

Nancy (or Anne) Lucas Turner third daughter of Thos. J. and Harriet J. R. Turner, was born at Spring Hill farm, residence of Gail Ewell, on 23rd January, 1870.

George Campbell Brown, third son of Campbell and Susan P. Brown, was born at Spring Hill farm, Sept. 25th 1871.

Harriet Stoddert Turner, fourth daughter of Thos. J. and Harriet J. Turner, was born at Spring Hill farm, November 16th 1871.

(Here ended the entries in the old record.)

Liza Ko Campbell Ewell, daughter of George W. and Harriet J. Campbell, and wife of Genl Richard S. Ewell, departed this life at 12 M., January 22^d (Monday) 1872.

General Richard S. Ewell, son of Dr. Thos. and Eliza S. Ewell, survived his wife but two days, dying at 1 A.M. of the 25th January, 1872. They are buried in one grave in the Nashville Cemetery.

Mary Lasker, fifth child and daughter of Thos. J. and Harriet J. Turner was born the afternoon of February 19th, 1873 - Wednesday.

Copy, from my Father's tomb this inscription: James Percy Brown, Born at Woodville Mississipi, April 9th 1812. Died at Nashville April 2^d 1844, aged 32 years, 11 months, 22 days.

Mrs. Rebecca Stoddert Hubbard, daughter of George and Rebecca Stoddert, died on the 26th March, 1872, at 6^½ P.M.,

b) aged 74 years, 8 months and 17 days - She left no children. Her husband Mr. Dan'l Hattard of Atlanta, survives her.

Percy, fourth son and child and 2^o of Campbell and Susan P. Brown
Lizinka Campbell first daughter 3^o were born at Spring Hill on
the morning of the sixth of April (Easter Monday) 1874.
He is the elder of the twins.

Henry Smith first son and sixth child of Thomas J. and
Harriet S. Turner was born on Christmas morning 1874,
at Normandy, St. Louis Co., Missouri.

Theodora Percy Turner was born at Marietta, (The Turner home) near
Normandy, Mo., on Sept. 11-1876.

Edith Rebecca Turner was born at the same place on Jan. 19-
1878.

Arthur Campbell second son and ninth child of Thos. J. and Harriet S.
Turner, was born at the same place on Oct. 22-1880.

April 4 1888, Julia M. Turner was married to Kingbury Waterman,
of St. Louis, Mo. He was divorced by her
Jan. 13rd 1889, Adele Youngbury, daughter of Kingbury & Julia M. Waterman
was born in St. Louis, Mo.

Campbell Brown, son of Jas. Percy and
Lizinka Campbell Brown, departed this
life at Grand Rapids, Mich, in the morn-
ing of August 30th, 1893. He is buried in
the cemetery of St. John's Church, Ashwood,
Tenn.

Susan Pack Brown, widow of Campbell
Brown, died suddenly at Pass Christian, Missis-
sippi, on the morning of Sunday, February 19th,
1922. She is buried beside her husband in St.
John's Churchyard at Ashwood, Maury County,
Tennessee. She was in the seventy-fifth year of
her age.

Susan Massie Pack Brown, eldest daughter and
first child of Susan Massie and Lucas Pack Brown, was
married on August 17th, 1929, to Chesney Hughes Lyon, son
of the late A. Augustine Lyon of Eastville, at Grace Church,
Spring Hill, Tennessee.

On Easter Day, April 20, 1930, a son was born to
Chesney Hughes and Susan Brown Lyon, at Spring Hill,
Tennessee. He is named James Adair Lyon.

Harriett Stoddert Turner, daughter of
James Percy and Lizinka Campbell Brown died at
her residence in the city of Washington on October 14, 1932,
in her 89th year after children Lizinka Campbell
Brown (unmarried) and Harry S. Turner had preceded
her. The latter left no children. Lizinka died at her
gravel near French, Madera.

On the 20th January, 1895, Lucius Park Brown
was married to Jessie Roberts, daughter of
Albert Roberts, Esq., of Nashville, in Christ
church in that city.

Campbell Shirley Brown, son of Lucius Park
and Jessie Roberts Brown, was born at
Nashville on the morning of October 25th,
1896.

Jessie Roberts Brown departed this life at
half past eight o'clock on the morning of
July 29, 1897, at Nashville, and in the
27th year of her age.

Lucius Campbell Brown departed this life at eight o'clock
in the evening of August 28th, 1899, at Hamilton Place,
Ashwood, Marin Co., Texas in the 26th year of her age.
She is buried near her father in St. John's Churchyard.

One the 40th day of September 1901, Richard Euilee Brown
was married to Marion Lee, daughter of ^{Born} Lee, Esq.
of New York City, at Sound Beach, Connecticut.

On Dec 12th 1903, Lucius Park Brown was united
in marriage to Susan Margaret Morris, daughter of Patrick C.
Morris, at St. James, the family home had now Mississinewa
in Newberry County, Indiana. Susan Margaret Park Brown's first daughter of Lucius & a
Susan Morris Brown was born at Nashville, Tennessee
Feb 11th 1906.

Ava Catherine, second daughter of Jos. L. Jr.
and Lizzie Campbell Brown Mosley,
was born at Flores, Ala., 21 March
1942.

Jos. H. Mosley III, third child
and first son of Jos. L. Jr., and
Lizina Campbell Brown Mosley, was
born in Wurzburg, Tex., on 25
March, 1945.

On 19 Sept., 1964, Lizzie Campbell Brown
was born in Houston, Texas, to Ted Fox Preston,
and Lizzie Campbell Mosley.

On 30 May, 1966, Ted Fox Preston, III was born
in Hous. Tex. to the above-named parents.

On 4 May, 1962, Ava Catherine Mosley
was married in St. George's Church, Nashville
to Robert John Channing, Jr., age Atlanta.

Richard Ewell Brown, second son of Campbell and
Marion Lee, only surviving daughter of Richard Ewell and
Marion Lee Brown, died on August 24th, 1921, at the
Presbyterian Hospital in New York City.

Richard Ewell Brown, second son of Campbell and
Susan Polk Brown, died at his home on First Street
St in New York City on June 14th, 1919; his death
is now first entered here; he is buried in the family
plot of his wife's people, at Southampton, Long Island, N.Y.

in this book, the entries from the late February 1922 are
made at the beginning of these sets, commencing on page following that
number "3" on margin left. S. P. D.

of Contreras & Churubusco"; to rank from 20 August 1847.
5. Captain to rank from 4th August, 1849.

Bryan, May 6, 1951.

Married Susan Lyon Bryan to Dan B. Smotherman
at Jeffersonville, Indiana July 13, 1953; by Justice
of the Peace.

Ruth Cabell Brown, youngest daughter of Lucius
Dale and Susan Catherine Morris Brown, was
married to Harold A. Broccoli, of Birmingham,
Ala., on Apr. 21, 1961, at St. Paul's Church,
Franklin, Tenn.

Doris, Jr., second daughter of Percy and Gertrude
Plunkett Brown, died at Louisville, Ky.,
Feb. 16, 1964. She is buried at St. John's,
Orchard.

On Aug. 7th 1907, Percy Brown was married to Gertrude
Margaret Plunkett, only daughter of Dr. Jas. Dale Plunkett
of this name, 1215 Tennesse Place, Nashville, Tenn.
Marion Lee, first daughter of W. Richard
Evans & Marion Lee Brown, was born in New York
at 11, W. 5th St., and died at 9 mo. old.
She is buried at Southampton, Long Island, N.Y.
Jas. Plunkett, first child of Percy & Gertrude Brown,
was born in Seminary, Franklin, Tenn., on
Nov. 1, 1910.

Susan Campbell, second daughter Lucius Paul
Susan Massie Brown, was born near Franklin, Tennessee,
see, on September 28, 1908.

Lucia-Cabell Brown, third daughter and third
child of Lucius Paul & Susan Massie, was
born near Franklin, Tennessee, on October 28th,
1910.

George E. Campbell, third son of Campbell
George E. Campbell Brown, died at Nashville
and Susan Campbell Brown, on January 23d, 1912, in the 40th year
of his age. He is buried in St. John's churchyard
of his adopted city. He is survived by John, his son and
Percy, second son and spouse of Percy and
Gertrude C. Brown, who was born at Ewell Farm
on April 12th, 1912.

Jas. Plunkett, first son and spouse of
Percy and Gertrude C. Brown, departed this
life on farm on Feb. 20th, at 12:30 P.M., 1948, at Ewell
Farm. He is buried in St. John's churchyard.

On January 20, 1933, there was born to Susan Brown Lyon, at her home in Lebanon, Tennessee, a daughter, named Susan Catherine Lyon.

Percy Brown, fourth son of Campbell and Susan Jackson Brown, died on March 26th, 1934, at his home "Hillcrest," near Charlottesville, Virginia - He is buried in St. John's Churchyard, at Ashwood, Tennessee.

Richard Burke, first son and second child of Richard Burke and Marion Lee Brown, was married to Olivia Claws, daughter of Mr. & Mrs. William George Wrightson, on 28 May 1933, in Orange, New Jersey.

Russell Polk, first and only surviving son of Campbell and Susan Rebecca Polk Brown, died at Nashville, Tennessee, on the afternoon of Thursday, 4 April 1935. He is buried in St. John's Churchyard, at Ashwood Tennessee.

Susan Catherine Gaa, daughter of C. Hughes and Susan Brown Lyon, was married on Aug. 22, 1950 at Davidson Co. Court House, Nashville, to James Austin Bryan son of Mr. & Mrs. B. A. Bryan of Battle Creek, Michigan. Divorced March 14, 1953.
