Col. Anthony Crockett whose recent death at Frankfort, Ky. has been announced in the public prints was a native of Virginia. He took a very active part in the war of the Revolution, and afterwards, in the Indian warfare of the West. In the last war with Great Britain, he also participated, in connection with the Kentucky volunteers that invaded Canada, and was present at the battle of the Thames, at Paratoga, in the war of the Revolution, he assisted, says the Washington Globe, in taking a new brass cannon, which was subsequently regarded by the British in the last war, at the surrender of Hull at Detroit. Col. Crockett was present on the Thames at the capture of this cannon from the British; and as a shaft of memorial, it was committed by Governor Shelby to the Artillery Company of the County in which Col. Crockett resided.
