James Roland Crow Dies In Birmingham
 James Roland Crow, age 67,
 died February 8th after having
 been in Birmingham, Ala. after having
 a heart attack. Funeral services
 were held February 10th at
 Brown's Service Chapel, that
 city, with Rev. Frank R. Moore
 officiating.
 Mr. Crow was the eldest son of
 the late Charlie and Penina
 Crow, and was born in the Piney
 community of Davidson County, Tenn.
 was a graduate from County High
 Normal College, and later taught
 school in Tennessee and Raleigh,
 Ga. He was married to Miss Ger-
 trude Arnold of Birmingham in 1910.
 After moving to Birmingham, Ala.,
 he became a credit manager
 for the Brown Department
 Store and R. E. White Opera
 Co.
 Mr. Crow was a Mason and a
 Shriner.
 Survivors include his wife,
 two daughters, Mrs. Robert E.
 Stapp, Mrs. Geo. W. Collins, and
 sons, James R. Jr., and H. D.
 Crow; 3 grandchildren, all of
