 myself in law Samuel Houston my negro girl wife  
 and his wife & no further will be granted than  
 my negro slaves and himself for and in con-  
 sideration of the fidelity and obedience with which  
 they have long served me enjoy their freedom after  
 my death. & so hereby indubitate Constitution and  
 appoint Nathan Russell Serr and William Gillespie  
 executors to my executors and carrying into effect  
 this my last will and Testament next of kin friends  
 neighbors and relatives all and every other will and  
 Testament by me at any time heretofore made and  
 so fully satisfy and confirm this and no other my

that money to be collected out of my Estate and  
my lands divided for the sole Benefit of my  
wife and children to be equally divided among  
them and if any of them should choose to keep the  
land then the one so choosing shall pay to the  
other two equal dividends in proportion equal in value  
to their slaves, the land, stone & lumber my brother  
Daniel Bower our sum and Pounds it being due to  
him out of monies that I have for his benefit and due  
for our land in Pennsylvania to be paid when the  
money can be collected for said debt but it is  
not my intention that we shall have it as my  
part thereof out of my Estate and if it should so  
happen that the said monies could not be had  
then we that are the most liable his part and I  
do also revoke all other wills and testaments and  
here are this my last will and testament In  
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and  
seal this fourth day of December in the year of  
our Lord one thousand eight hundred and  
ninety eight.

land of which I am possessor laying and being in Blount  
County and also my slave John slave and also have  
an equal interest in the land John slave and also a  
equal interest in a negro boy slave named Zacharias  
4<sup>th</sup> that my daughter Mary Elizabeth McAdam shall have  
a yellow girl slave named Anna and also a good  
horse and saddle and a good mule and farm  
team 5<sup>th</sup> that my daughter Malinda McAdam have my  
yellow girl slave Anna and also a good horse saddle  
and bridle and good bed and furniture  
6<sup>th</sup> that my two daughters Mary E. McAdam and  
Sarah McAdam in equal interest my girl Malinda  
slave and his in equal 8<sup>th</sup> I do hereby constitute and  
appoint my beloved wife Phoebe McAdam and James  
Miller and James Cockridge B. Executrix of this my last  
will and testament hereby revoking all other his former  
wills or testaments by me hitherto made in  
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and  
seal this eighth day of February 1848
