L. Cummings executor of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 20th day of August in the year of our Lord 1824.

Second I give and devise to my son Robert part of the land I now live on agreeable to a conditional line made in presence of Samuel Murray, &c. I give and devise to my son William the other part of the land I now live on agreeable to said line and all my upper plantation adjacent my former line and all my farming utensils and hares as she now stands and all my fine stoves and one feather bed and furniture except what I have bequeathed to my wife, &c. I give and devise to my son James the parcel of land that he now lives on agreeable to a line made in presence of Samuel Murray, &c. I give and bequeath to each of my five daughters fifteen dollars in cash to be paid by my son William in two years after my wife's death, &c. witnesses whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 1st day of May Ann Thoms and Eight hundred and five,
