 months. The above I give me of my force while I live, but after my death to
 be in full force and action in law.

 also four tract or land to wit the tract on which I now live the
 1st of 9.7.17. my above tract running up the river to the land then
 formerly owned by Lewis and my brother John W. Conrad also I
 have in trust of a fifty acre tract and a large piece of land
 containing in all by estimation ten hundred and sixty four acres
 one horse head which ever one she may choose one side I add to her
 tride in cows and calves the head of three pigs six sheep all
 all my household and kitchen furniture to have and to hold
 for her only use and benefit and for the raising and educating
 of my little son Andrew during her natural life or widowhood
 and whereas I my son John Conrad will live with his mother and
 support her comfortably and live with her peaceably and and will cause
 to and issue his brother Andrew and when he is of age give him a horse
 saddle and tride worth eighty dollars I wish him to have the use of
 said lands and live with his mother's death and after her death the
 land to be divided between my two sons John and Andrew John to
 have two thirds of the lower end or as to include the buildings. And
 Andrew to have one third of the upper end to be divided according
 to the number of acres and quality without taking into consideration
 the buildings.
 And thirdly I leave and bequeath unto my son James Conrad one
 hundred dollars to be paid as soon as it can be made out of the
 estate.
 And fourthly I wish all my lands and property not mentioned in
 this will to be sold and the proceeds spent or created to pay my
 just debts funeral expenses and the money to James and what ever is
 left after the above is done I will to my son James Conrad.
 And fifthly I wish my son Andrew to have and to hold

 I wish I give and bequeath to my daughter George one hundred
 dollars with her saddle to have her support of the place while
 she live or remains single.
 I wish I give and bequeath to my daughter Jane one hundred
 dollars and her saddle and her support of the place while
 she remains single.
 I wish I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha one hundred
 and dollars and her saddle with her support of the place as
 long as she remains single.
 I wish I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary one hundred
 dollars with her saddle and support of the place as long as
 she remains single.
 I wish I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy one
 hundred dollars and a new side saddle when needed with her
 support of the place as long as she remains single.
 I wish I give and bequeath to my daughter Ester one hundred
 dollars and a new saddle when needed with her support of
 the place while she remains single.
 I wish I give and bequeath to my son Matthew Henry one
 large good mare and a good gelding.
 I wish I give and bequeath to my son James B. and Matthew
 Henry the plantation this now live on which place Thomas
 and sisters is to have their support of with all the furniture
 utensils and further after than is set about a sufficient supply of
 grain and stock for one year support the balance to be sold
 and a third to be pay money before directed if they should
 not be enough to pay all of them if as directed J.B. and
 Matthew K. Conrad will pay the balance at a convenient time
 without interest in six payments I also allow a settlement to be made
 with James H. Conrad and my executor with the wife of
 James B. and Matthew Henry from the first of our separation
 I allow James H. Conrad to have the plantation and the land
 on and to support himself and family during his life

it from the payment of made in the said land with rent off the third of the place for the present year
I give and bequeath to my son Samuel a judgment on John J. Shaw which obtained before Edmund Haymen Esq.
And I give and bequeath to my son Robert J. Cochran twenty dollars out of a note of hold on James May which certified of further that my executors see that the form is kept up and that my wife and daughter have their support
Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint Shadrach Fingerson and John Walker my executors in witness where of I do to this my will set my hand and seal this 25th day August one thousand eight hundred and fifty one

I Silas Cochran of the County of Blount and State of Tennessee do make and publish this as my last will and testament I first direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of my money that may first come into the hands of my executors
Secondly I direct that my small horse be set apart for the purpose of paying my debts as soon as possible provide the horse can be sold for one hundred twenty dollars otherwise to be sold with the balance of my personal property
Thirdly I give and bequeath to my wife Sarah a Christian school man and all the house hold furniture I further direct that the balance of my personal property be sold at public sale I also direct that my land to be sold at private sale provided it can be sold for five hundred dollars otherwise to be exposed to public sale at the highest bidding
Fourthly I give and bequeath to my wife Sarah the one half of all the proceeds of all the above mentioned property during her natural life or widowhood then to return equally amongst all my brothers and sisters fifthly I give and bequeath the one half of all the proceeds of my personal property and land equally divided amongst all my brothers and sisters
Sixthly I do hereby nominate and appoint Eli Piskay my executor in witness where of I do to this my will set my hand and seal this 29th day of November 1839

In the name of God Amen
I Jacob Coxner planter and Miller of the County of Blount and State of Tennessee being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and disposing memory thanks be given unto almighty God for the same Now calling into mind the mortality of my body and being sensible that a dissolution is at hand I therefore make and ordain this instrument of writing to be my last will and testament revoking all others which may have been heretofore or hereafter Now as respects such worldly estate as it has been pleased God to bless me with in this life I give and bequeath and do hereby dispose of the same to my wife Ann and substance as follows viz
First of all my will is that all my personal property of every kind be sold by my executors herein mentioned to the best advantage either private or public as they may deem best and most advisable immediately after my death and the money arising from the sale thereof to be paid for the payment of all my just debts and legacies and the residue of the money if any remains my will is that it be reserved and used in paying a tract of land herein mentioned
Second I give and bequeath to my grand children which are now or may hereafter be born to my daughter Nancy Snider all the land belonging to me of the tract of land annexed near line including the mill and all the low grounds and water as high up the creek as Beans line by estimation twenty acres more or less for the purpose of supporting them together until the youngest child arrives at the age of twenty one years and at that time I allow all the land mill and everything appertaining thereto to be sold by my executors or their successors to the best advantage and equally divided amongst the children of my daughter Nancy Snider as afore said to be to them their heirs and assigns forever And my will is also that my wife Sarah live together with my daughter Nancy Snider and my son in law
