paid as soon as possible after my death out of my money that then I  
may be possessed of hereafter of give and bequeath all that I may be  
possessed of at my death Viz my lands and tenements all my house hold  
and kitchen furniture all my live stock of all kinds to my beloved wife  
Elizabeth Lammie to have and to hold as long as she lives. Secondly of give and  
bequeath one dollar to my son James Lammie after my wife deceased to my  
son and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Egerton at the decease of my wife  
fiftieth of give and bequeath one dollar to my son Thomas Lammie at the decease  
of my wife 6<sup>th</sup> of give and bequeath one dollar to my son Edward Lammie at  
the decease of my wife 8<sup>th</sup> of give and bequeath one dollar to my son James  
Lammie at the decease of my wife 8<sup>th</sup> of give and bequeath to my son Edward  
Lammie one dollar at the decease of my wife 9<sup>th</sup> of give and bequeath to my  
son the sum of one dollar at the decease of my wife 11<sup>th</sup> of give and bequeath  
to my son William Lammie one dollar at the decease of my wife 12<sup>th</sup>  
of give and bequeath to my son John Lammie and my daughter Elizabeth  
Lammie the remainder of my estate to be equally divided between them.  
In the above shares mentioned out at the decease of my wife lastly I do hereby  
nominate our beloved my wife Elizabeth Lammie my executor in virtues  
whereby I do this my will set my hand and seal this the 6<sup>th</sup> day of September  
1840 at my home in Hampton.

Twinkles of give and bequeath unto my son Jerome Lammie one dollar  
one hoss James Lammie and Robert Egerton together of him one horse to  
be equally divided between them its price to be worth fifty dollars  
Eighty of give and bequeath unto son James Lammie one dollar  
Fiftieth of give and bequeath unto my son Jerome Lammie one dollar  
Seventy of give and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret Egerton  
one Beavers and one Cow. Eighty of give and bequeath to my  
son Jerome Lammie one dollar. Eighty of give and bequeath unto  
my son William Lammie all lands and tenements that is in my  
possession and all living stock horses cattle hogs and all the  
house hold furniture and kitchen furniture and all debts and  
everything that belongs unto the legal heirs in this will  
Ninety of give and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Lammie her  
portion of the sum that she has done and the best and last debts  
settled I do hereby nominate and appoint my son William Lammie my  
executor in virtues whereby I do this the 6<sup>th</sup> day of September last will set my

### State of Tennessee Blount County

In the name of God Amen I George Lammie of the County before  
said Lammie one five mile back King & Son's mill cut adjoining  
mines for which of these Gods And calling to mind the uncertainties of  
life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly substance as I  
here place God to bless me with. At this County Court day of August  
one thousand eight hundred and twenty five wrote and published the my last  
will and testament in manner follows that is to say,

First of give and bequeath all that part of my tract of land  
that I now live on that lies north of mine mill back to my two  
sons Wm Lammie and Samuel to be their right and property. It is to  
be understood that the said James and Samuel is to pay to  
each of the others one hundred dollars a property valued at tract  
rate that is to say to John Lammie and James and the said James and  
Samuel is to pay the other the demand the have against him for part of  
my land lying on the south side of mine mill back and to clear  
it out of the state of fire

Secondly I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth and her  
children all the land I own on the south side of land of five  
miles back together with all and every tract of property now and  
time to be their own right and to be equally divided between them  
between said. And I hereby make and declare my beloved wife  
Elizabeth Lammie and my son Samuel left Executor and executor  
of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand and seal this my last will and testament  
the day and date above written
