5th it is my will that Mary Allen shall receive Twenty five dollars also Miss Blanks him fifteen dollars with the addition of the fifteen dollars I stand bound for as Executor of my fathers will

6th it is my will that my sister Mary Kirkpatrick shall have the bed ^{room} on and one Calves Quilt and ten dollars also one fifth part of the price of the one half of the land when sold

7th it is my will that my sister Margaret A. Gaughy shall have my

and one and one fifth part of one half of ^{my} land

8th it is my will that my sister Sarah Purdie and Polly Shaw

and my brother Robert Boyd have each an equal share

in the price of the land with Mary Kirkpatrick and Margaret

A. Gaughy and it is my will that my black boy Hardy be set

free at the age of twenty one and that my Executors shall make

whatever arrangements they may think advantageous with him to

be twenty one and learn him to read the bible it is my will that

James Boyd have my bed that has the striped tick and puter

James Boyd Jun 17th 1825

In the name of God Amen I William Boyd of the State of Tennessee and County of Blount being weak in body though of perfect mind and memory and willing to mind the mortality of my body do make and appoint this as my last will and testament and first of all I give my soul to God that give it and my body to the dust from whence it is taken to be buried in a Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors and as to the property that is has pleased God to bless me with it is my will that it be disposed of in the following manner

I Mary Cotter of the County of Blount and State of Tennessee being of sound mind and disposing memory but weak of body and calling to mind the uncertainty of death do make and publish this as my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all wills by me heretofore made and first I direct that my funeral expenses and all my just debts be paid as soon as possible after my decease out of any monies that I may be seized or possessed of or that may first come into the hands of my Executors heretofore to be named Secondly I give and bequeath to Mary White my Saddle Spindly I give and bequeath to Mary Cotter and Mary White my two beds and furniture and all my clothing to be equally divided between them Thirdly I give and bequeath to Annan Cotter on Christ Fifthly I give and bequeath to John W. Cotter all the residue of my estate of whatever description it may consist land money household and kitchen furniture during his natural life and at his death to be equally divided between Annan Cotter and Mary White or their heirs and lastly I do constitute and appoint John W. Cotter and Annan Cotter the Executors of this my last will and testament witness my hand and seal this 21st day of November 1825
