 6th it is my will that my sister Margaret Kirkpatrick shall have the bed & bedding in and one leather Quilt and ten dollars also one tyro Pen & the price of the one half of the land when sold
 7th it is my will that my sister Margaret McLaughy shall have my bed and bedding and one fifth part of one half of the land
 8th it is my will that my sister Sarah Porter and Polly Shaw and my brother Robert Bruce shall have each an equal share in the price of the land with Nancy Kirkpatrick and Margaret McLaughy and it is my will that my black boy Hardy be set free at the age of twenty one and that my executors shall make whatever arrangements they may think advantageous with him to be twenty one and learn him to read the Bible it is my will that Zachariah Bird shall have my bed and the striped tick sheet also the loom
 As to the executors I also pay for their trouble I appoint my friends James Boyd and William McPhee to execute this my last will and testament in the presence of

In the name of God Amen I William Boyd of the State of Tennessee and County of Blount being weak in body though of perfect mind and memory and calling to mind the mortality of my body do make and appoint this as my last will and testament and first of all give myself to God that gave it and my body to the dust from whence it is taken to be buried as a Christian deserves at the discretion of my Executors and as to the property that I have hereon left to bless me with it is my will that it be disposed of in the following manner

 8th it is my will that my sister Sarah Porter and Polly Shaw and my brother Robert Bruce shall have each an equal share in the price of the land with Nancy Kirkpatrick and Margaret McLaughy and it is my will that my black boy Hardy be set free at the age of twenty one and that my executors shall make whatever arrangements they may think advantageous with him to be twenty one and learn him to read the Bible it is my will that I leave to Boyd my slave that has the striped tick sheet and patch also the loom

I Mary Cotter of the County of Blount and State of Tennessee being of sound mind and disposing memory but hear of body and calling to mind the uncertainty of life as man and publish this as my last will and testament hereby revoking and cancelling all wills by me heretofore made and first I direct that my funeral expenses and all my just debts be paid as soon as possible after my decease out of any monies that may be seized or possessed of or that may get come into the hands of my executors heritable to be named Secondly I give and bequeath to Andrew White my Saddle Thirdly I give and bequeath to Nancy Cotter and Nancy White my two beds and furniture and all my clothing to be equally divided between them Fourthly I give and bequeath to Andrew Cotter on Chest Fifthly I give and bequeath to John W. Cotter all the residue of my estate of whatever description it may consist land money house chold and kitchen furniture during his natural life and at his death to be equally divided between Andrew Cotter and Nancy White or their heirs and lastly I do constitute and appoint John W. Cotter and Andrew Cotter the executors of this my last will and testament witness my hand and seal this 1st day of November 1851
