It is also my wish that my wife assume the administration of this my last will and Testament together with whomsoever she may deem proper to act with her. Given under my hand and seal this 12th day of April 1845.

I James Freeman of Blount County and State of Tennessee being sound in mind and in my proper senses do hereby make my last will and Testament as follows: I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Lucy Freeman during her natural life that tract of land upon which Wadsworth Kidell now lives, situate, and adjoining the tract above Eliza I now now lives, being that portion of the tract of land which now belongs to me and which I purchased from Samuel Glass. I also bequeath to my aforesaid wife Lucy during her natural life, the following negroes: Bob and his wife Mrs. Dick, Fannie, Jo, & Jack, also Robin, Reuben and Abram. I further bequeath to my said wife all my stock of live cattle now on hand, including three cows and heifers and all other domestication of stock together with all my household furniture and finishing utensils to be and belong to said Lucy Freeman during her natural life after the decease of my aforesaid wife Lucy Freeman the aforesaid tract of land bequeathed to my wife Lucy will revert to and become the property of my son John Freeman, the negro Robin above named and bequeathed as above to Lucy Freeman will after her decease become the property of my son David Freeman, the negroes Reuben and Abram above named and bequeathed as above to my wife Lucy will at her decease revert to and become the property of my daughter Eliza Davis. The household furniture above described and bequeathed together with the stock above described also for use and profits of my son John and my daughter Eliza to be between them equally divided. I also give and bequeath to my sons Robert Foster and James Lee

dollars each, in testimony of which I hereunto set my hand and seal this 21st day of August 1845, in presence of John Stephens and Peter Hume, subscribing witnesses. I also appoint John Freeman, seal executor and Eliza Davis executrix of this my last will and Testament giving them all legal power to carry the same into effect day and date as aforesaid given under my hand and seal this 21st day of August 1845.

In the name of God Amen I Robert Warren of Blount County and State of Tennessee being sound of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for all men to die do make and enact this my last will and Testament that is to say give and bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God then given to me and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form: First I give to my son James L. Warren the hundred acres of land on the lower end of my plantation, likewise I give to my son Wally M. Warren the hundred acres of land on the upper end of said plantation to be laid off by my executors, the balance of my plantation at my death I give to my son Joshua M. Warren and on his death I give the same to my daughter Nancy. At my death I desire that my negro woman Nancy be set free, likewise at my death I desire that my four negroes, namely one girl named Mary, three boys named Smith, Cook, Brown and Nathan be equally divided by my executors between my three daughters viz: Paulina M. Pittman, Elizabeth M. Warren and Nancy M. Warren, and Elizabeth and Nancy is to have each of them a horse worth seventy dollars in value and a saddle for each of them out of my estate the balance of my estate I desire to be sold immediately after my death and after paying all just debts and funeral expenses the remainder to be equally divided between my six children, namely James L. Warren, Wally M. Warren, Paulina L. Pittman, Joshua M. Warren, Elizabeth M. Warren and Nancy M. Warren, and I likewise give and bequeath to my six wives Elizabeth M. Warren, namely as follows: to Charles M. Warren and William B. Warren, Martha M. Warren, Susan M. Warren, Susan M. Warren, Susan M. Warren.

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
