paid for which I hold a receipt thirty dollars.

have paid for which I hold a receipt thirty dollars

6^d as to my daughter Margaret Culpate now deceased I have given
her one hundred and fifty dollars for which I hold her receipt which
is her equivalent 7^d I leave to my son John Gaunt the plantation
whereon I now live with all the appurtenances thereto belonging
with all the farming utensils the Wagon and one Pepple Tree the Cross
Cut Saw and the Family Bible one Shovel and tongs

8th After the Legacies before named is satisfied and over their expenses
that may occur any surplus money that may be on hand or any notes
of hand or stock of the old Knoxville Bank or any dividend their stock
that may be unsettled or any money Received from the State or else
where by me paid to the State in consequence of the land I now live
on with all the household and Kitchen furniture and all the live
Stock not otherwise appropriated to be equally divided between Polly
Rigaudas and John Fault and Anna Wilson and Emma Eagle in

ed me by the last will of my husband now whether remains of said
thirty dollars or never intend to be collected off said sum if the fifty
dollars in said obligation on said men for a Servant man named
Allen to be paid me be sufficient for my burial expenses. Lastly I
appoint and constitute James McConnell executor of this my last

J M 1808 Gamble Seur of Blount County in the State of Tennessee do hereby make my last will and testament in manner and forme following that is

3rd. I give to my brother Alexander B. Gamble at the death of my wife the plantation where I now live to be enjoyed by him and his heirs forever

4th. I give to my brother in law John Daigre at the death of my said wife two 8 male tracts of land lying on Crooked Creek where James Laughrod last lived to be enjoyed by him and his heirs forever

I give to Polly Bonett at the death of my said wife another tract of land lying on Crooked Creek where James Williamson now lives to be enjoyed by her and his heirs forever but in case she should die without Children then I give the said land to my brother Alexander B. Gamble and his heirs forever I likewise give her our feather bed and furniture

6th. I give to John Henry and his heirs twenty five dollars out of a note I hold on him and I give the balance of said note to Josiah D. Henry

7th. I give to Hugh Henry Jr and Eliza G. Birt ten dollars and to be paid by James Henry out of a note I hold on him and the balance of said note I give to Josiah James Henry
