 2^d To my daughter Elisabeth Wear I give in addition to what I have paid for which I hold a receipt thirty dollars.
 3^d To my daughter Polly Reynolds one hundred and thirty dollars.
 4th To my daughter Ann Wilson one hundred and thirty dollars.
 5th To my daughter Elena Caperton I give in addition to what I have paid for which I hold a receipt thirty dollars.
 6th as to my daughter Margaret Antipatriate now deceased I have given her one hundred and fifty dollars for which I hold her receipt which is her equivalent.
 7th I leave to my son John Paulk the plantation whereon I now live with all the appurtenances there to belonging I with all the farming utensils the Wagon and one Rifle Gun the Cross Cut Saw and the family Bible one Shovel and tongs.
 8th After the Legacies before named is satisfied and any other expenses that may occur any surplus money that may be on hand or any note of hand or stock of the old Knoxville Bank or any dividend that may be received or any money refunded from the State or otherwise by me paid to the State in consequence of the land I now live on with all the household and kitchen furniture and all the live stock not otherwise appropriated to be equally divided between Polly Reynolds and John Paulk and Ann Wilson and Elena Caperton.
 9th Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my sons Joseph Wilson and John Paulk executors of this my last will and testament and hereby revoke all former wills or testaments heretofore by me made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 7th day of July in the year of our Lord 1830.

 5th I give to Polly Bonetti at the death of my said wife another tract of land lying on Crooked Creek where James Williamson now lives to be enjoyed by her and his heirs forever but in case she should die without children then I give the said land to my brother Alexander B.  6th I give to John Henry and his heirs twenty five dollars out of a note I hold on him and I give the balance of said note to John Henry.

- 4th Some time past I give to my daughter Polly Farmer what she
