east Tennessee being weak of body but of sound mind and desirous
dying for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of
human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly substance as
it hath pleased God to blesse me with I give and bequeath the same in
the manner following that is to say 1st after all my just debts are paid
which to my knowledge there are none I give and bequeath to my beloved
wife Margaret Gaunt all the property that may be in hand both real
and personal that came into our hands by marriage absolutely for her
use and sefton with the addition of one long horse Calt two two cows
and Calves all of the sheep and half of the hogs that may be at my
decease and one half of the Corn or grain that may be in hands at
my decease after the expence of raising said Corn or grain is paid
one Secretary or a Bureau in Room there of one stanch of Bees worth
dollars in money.

2^d To my daughter Elisabeth Wear & give in addition to what I have
paid for which I hold a receipt thirty dollars.

3^d To my daughter Polly Reynolds one hundred and thirty dollars

4^d To my daughter Ann Wilson one hundred and thirty dollars

5^d To my daughter Elena Egleton & give in addition to what I
have paid for which I hold a receipt thirty dollars

6^d as to my daughter Margaret Rinkpatrick now deceased I have given
her one hundred and fifty dollars for which I hold her receipt which
is her equivalent 7^d I leave to my son John Gaunt the plantation
whereon I now live with all the appurtenances there to belonging /
with all the farming utensils the Wagon and one Pepple Tree the Cross
Cut Saw and the Family Bible one Shovel and tongs

8th After the Legacies before named is satisfied and over their expenses
that may occur any surplus money that may be in hands or any notes
of hand or stock of the old Knoxville Bank or any division thereto stock
that may be unsettled or any money received from the State or else
where by me paid to the State in consequence of the land I now live
on with all the household and Kitchen furniture and all the live
Stock not otherwise appropriated to be equally divided between Polly
Regulars and John Faull and Ann Wilson and Emma Taylor
9th Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my sons Joseph
Wilson and John Faull executors of this my last will and testament
out hereby revoking all former wills or testaments heretofore by me
made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 7th
day of July in the year of our Lord 1833 John Wilson Robert W. Collier H. P. Pendleton

of Blount and State of Tennessee being weak of body but of sound
mind and desirous memory for which I thank Almighty God and call
unto mind the mortality of my body and wishing to dispose of my worldly
 substance which it hath pleased God to bless me with. I dispose of said sub-
 stance as follows Viz 1st that my funeral expenses be paid.
1st I give and bequeath to my Sister-in-law Elizabeth Keniston the sum of
one hundred and twenty dollars also a note of hand on William Leopold
and John Dowerman for the sum of eighty one dollars also one note of
hand bequeath me due to Samuel Keniston Moore I also give and bequeath
to Isabella Ann Moore one bed and bed clothes and trunks. And further
I pay an obligation on John Gillespie James Gillespie James McLean or
Jacob F. Scott and Samuel Moore for thirty dollars yearly allow-
ed me by the last will of my husband now whether remains of said
thirty dollars of money intend to be collected off said men if the fifty
dollars in said obligation on said men for a Servant man named
John to be paid me be sufficient for my burial expenses. Lastly I
appoint and constitute James McConnell executor of this my last

I Moses Gamble Seur of Blount County in the State of Tennessee do hereby make my last will and testament in manner and form following that is

1st. I choose that all my just debts be paid and satisfied out of the money that is due and owing to me by different persons

2nd. after the payment of my debts and funeral expenses I give to my wife Rachel Gamble all my land for and during the term of her natural life to be divided among the persons and in the manner herein after named & give her one note on Samuel Henry I give her my Stock of hogs and cattle and all the house hold and kitchen furniture to be disposed of as she pleases

3rd. I give to my brother Alexander P. Gamble at the death of my wife the plantation where I now live to be enjoyed by him and his heirs forever

4th. I give to my brother in law John Daquin at the death of my said wife two 8 male tracts of land lying on Crooked where James Daquin and last lived to be enjoyed by him and his heirs forever

5th. I give to Polly Bonito at the death of my said wife another tract of land lying on Crooked Creek where James Threeman now lives to be enjoyed by her and his heirs forever but in case she should die without Children then I give the said land to my brother Alexander P. Gamble and his heirs forever I further give her our feather bed and furniture

6th. I give to John Henry and his heirs twenty five dollars out of a note I hold on him and I give the balance of said note to Josie Henry

7th. I give to Hugh Henry Jr and Anna C. Pitt ten dollars out to be paid by James Henry out of a note I hold on him and the balance of said note I give to said James Henry
