In the name of God Amen this Nineteenth day of October
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and twenty five I William Gillespie Son of the County
of Belmont and State of Tennessee being fully and
lawfully of sound mind and disposing mind and being
fully aware of the uncertainty of life and the certainty
of death do hereby make my last will and
Testament. First when it shall please Providence to
remove me hence I will and bequeath my soul to
God who gave it, and my body to the church to be
decently interred, next I bequeath my worldly estate
both real and personal I will and bequeath in the
following manner to wit, I will and bequeath to
my beloved wife Ann Gillespie One thousand and twenty
dollars in cash to be divided and paid out of my estate
and paid to her by my Executors herein after appointed
I do further will and bequeath my said wife Ann
her choice of one horse or more also her choice of the
cow, and three young cattle of my property I
do further will and bequeath her so much of my
household and Kitchen furniture as she may deem
proper to take and as much of the present furniture
of this house I now live on as will support her family
for one year after my death all of which is to be at
her absolute disposal I also will and bequeath to my
said wife Ann Gillespie Thirty dollars to be paid her
annually so long as she shall survive and in lieu of
the one hundred and twenty dollars before mentioned
I do further will and bequeath to my said wife Ann
during her natural life her choice of one of my four
negro slaves Fanny Allen Nelson and Anderson and if
the negro so chosen should at any time before the
decease of my said wife Ann die or become unable
to labor then I do further will and bequeath my said
wife Ann her choice of any one of the remaining three

and that she enjoy his or her service during her said
Ann's natural life I do further will and bequeath to my
son James Gillespie one third of my son John's estate one
third and to the wife of my deceased son
Robert Gillespie namely Esther H. Houston William P. Gillespie
James G. Gillespie Martha G. Gillespie Robert A. Gillespie Martha
M. Gillespie and Mary C. Gillespie one third of my
negro slaves before mentioned after my wife Ann
shall have made her choice as aforesaid and after
the decease of my wife Ann and hereunder said
negro slave by her choice as aforesaid in the proportion
aforesaid to my said sons James & John and the wife
of my deceased son Robert James and they shall each
Contribute one third of the said sum of thirty dollars
to be paid as aforesaid to my wife Ann during her
natural life that is to say my son James shall
pay me said and the before named wife of my
deceased son Robert shall pay one third of the said
sum of thirty dollars annually and provided
also each of the aforesaid three parties shall contribute
one third of the expense that has or may be incurred
in supporting myself and family during my
natural life which upon my decease shall appear
from the accounts sufficiently attested of my son
James John and Robert and if any of the aforesaid
three parties shall fail or refuse to pay or contribute
the aforesaid proportions then I will and bequeath that
the aforesaid negro slaves shall be divided in the
proportions to the three aforesaid parties they shall
have paid or contributed as aforesaid I do further will
and bequeath that my Executors herein after appointed
shall dispose of the land upon which I now live either
at public or private sale or other wise as they shall
deem most expedient for so much thereof as shall
be sufficient to indemnify my sons James & John Gillespie
for any debt or debts which they may have paid
or may pay as securities of my said deceased
son Robert Gillespie and also for any moneys they
may have paid or may pay in the administration
of the estate of my said deceased son Robert Gillespie
for which they may have received no consideration
all which shall be made appear to my said Execu-
tors upon a fair and equitable settlement by them to
be made with my said sons James & John Gillespie
I do further will and bequeath if said Executors
and said James & John do agree in said settlement
is if any difficulty should arise about any other
provision or subsequent provision of this will that
the same shall be referred to three disinterested men
to be chosen by the parties whose decision is the
decision of a Majority of them shall be good and
final to all intents and purposes I do further will
and bequeath that

my said son James & John as aforesaid if there shall remain any of the land undivided of shall apply the same in the sales thereof or so much thereof as may be sufficient for that purpose to the payment of any just debts or debts remaining due and unpaid of my deceased son Robert Gillespie should there not be property sufficient for that purpose of his estate and after the payment of said debts any there be then remain a balance of my said land undivided of I will and desire this same to my daughter in law Mary Gillespie during her natural life to Esther H. Hamilton William F. Gillespie James H. Gillespie Martin L. Gillespie Robert A. Gillespie Mathew M. Gillespie and Mary C. Gillespie children and heirs of my deceased son Robert Gillespie and their heirs forever my said daughter in law Mary Gillespie to enjoy during her natural life a portion of the aforesaid land equal to that of any one of the aforesaid heirs. I do further will and bequeath to my daughter Ann Rutledge Agnes Hamilton Polly Boyd and Elizabeth Boyd each the dowry I have heretofore given them to the wife and he heirs to enjoy in law Samuel Hamilton my negro girl wife and her heirs I do further will and bequeath that my heirs James, John and David for and in consideration of the fidelity and obedience with which they have long served me enjoy their freedom after my death. I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint Mathew Russell Esq. and William Gillespie Esq. my Executors to execute and carry into effect this my last will and Testament and I do hereby nominate and make all and every other will and Testament by me at any time heretofore made and do hereby ratify and confirm the same and no other my last will and Testament. of my own and willing doubting but that at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give devise and dispose of the same in full manner and full following that is to say in the first place I allow my personal and real property to be sold and the land as soon as my part can be returned by my Executors to my son George Washington Bann by Lanty Bowerman I gave and bequeath the eighth share in the next place I wish all expenses that may come against the estate to be paid in the next place I give and bequeath the whole of my Estate that may remain to my dearly beloved wife Hannah and I do hereby ratify disallow revoke rescind all and every other and former Testament will and legacies be devised and bequeathed ratifying and thus intending this and no other to be my last will and Testament.
