4th I give and bequeath to my son William Coulson a note of David Bond on hand dated the seventh of August 1801 for Eighty Six Dollars and fifty Cents 5th I give and bequeath to my son John James Coulson and my daughter Sally Coulson the tract of land I bought of Alexander McLeister also the land so bought of Peter Smith with the residue and remainder of my property if any to be equally divided amongst them to them their heirs and assigns forever they paying out of said lands of property one hundred dollars to my son William Coulson and fifty dollars to my Grand daughter Lavinia Coulson

6th I do hereby appoint my son John Coulson Executor to this my last will and Testament and do hereby revoke and disannul all former wills or wills by me made and constituted this and this only my last will and Testament In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 3^d day of April 1803

1st It is my will that my two sons Philmer W. and G. B. Green shall have all my land that lies on the headwaters of the amount is 650 acres to be equally divided, leaving in view both quantity and quality.
 2nd It is my will that Joseph L. Doyle shall have all the goods that is in my store house and it is my will that the present heirs of my sister Margaret Doyle shall have lot No. 9, with its appertinances in the town of Coleraine, also the same of land joining Wilson Prater.
 3rd It is my will that Andrew Doyle shall have one hundred dollars when collected out of what is owing me when collected.
 4th It is my will that my father Philmer Green shall have the south half of the lot No. 10 in the town of Coleraine, also in lots of land that joins the and other also partly rising land joining the Coleraine place and also that after the legacies left to each are paid to be paid out of what is owing to me that my father shall have one half of the remainder of what is owing by him, paying to my sister Anglin Montgomery her share of the amount out of it that he in his wisdom may apportion just and right. - 10th It is my will that my mother shall have one hundred dollars of the money that is in my hand and my boy Perry that is or my father's.
 11th It is my will that my brother Anthony B. Green shall have an equal portion with my father of all the debts when collected, also all the money and property that is not specifically named herebefore to me or more individuals - 12th It is my will that my brother Anthony B. Green shall execute this my last will, in witness whereof I have set my hand and seal Rev. King and discharging me from and former wills by me made, this 25th day of September 1843. - Signed sealed and acknowledged to be his last will and testament in the presence of us who in his presence and at his request have set our names as witnesses to the same.
