among my Children herein after named, equally and to
be enjoyed by them and their heirs forever. Finally I desire
and appoint my friends Rutley Hargrave Esq. General
Wm. Wallace and Allen S. Bryant Esq. a committee to
divide the remainder of my negroes in eight lots of
equal value as near as may be for the interest of my
eight Children the heirs of my body viz: Mrs. Wilson L.
Brumley, John W. Brumley, Mary C. Brumley wife of Daniel
L. Brumley of 10th David C. Brumley and L. Brumley
Mtha L. Brumley, Emma L. C. Brumley and Pally W.
Brumley to be drawn by Lot by each heir and when
it may happen that some shall draw lots of higher
value than others, those so doing shall pay an amount
so as to make all the heirs above named share equally
in my said negroes, and further I request the above
named Gentlemen together with John Mullenders Esq. as
surveyor to divide my said land and farm in two equal parts
so as to give the one half of said farm with the mansion
house and to my wife Eliza Brumley as her life then
shall end the other half together with my farm on
Boys Leg. I wish and request the said Gentlemen
to divide into eight equal parts lots to be given for by
my said eight Children so that each of my said heirs
may inherit my lands equally. Finally out of my
said I give to my son Daniel Brumley a certain tract of
land known as his horse and to each of my three daugh-
ters Mtha L. Brumley, Emma L. C. Brumley and Pally W. Brumley I give the
following lots viz: To Martha L. C. Brumley the in two lots viz:
C. Brumley L. C. Brumley young lots and to Pally W. Brumley
young lots - and to my two daughters Emma L. C.
Brumley and Pally W. Brumley I give twenty five dollars
each to procure a Sudden Bride and blanket a
piece for them, which I wish my Executors to pay
over to them out of my money that may remain in
their hands after the liquidation of all my debts, and
if after complying with all the conditions and parts
of this my will, there should remain in their hands
any money belonging to my estate it is my desire that
it be divided equally among my eight Children above
named and my wife Eliza Brumley and share alike
And lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my sons Wilson L. Brumley
and John W. Brumley Executors of this my last will and testament hereby
making all other former wills and testaments by me heretofore made
void and of no effect. I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day
of August A.D. 1848.

personal property except such as may be necessary
for the support and comfort of my wife during her
natural life and out of the proceeds of such sales
to pay all my just debts - & the residue of my
estate with all the real estate and improvements
thereof the household and kitchen furniture, farming
implements and such of my live stock as may
need. I desire my Executors as above to come to my
beloved wife Margaret during her natural life.
At the decease of my wife Margaret for services rendered
to me and my family for upwards of twenty years
by her which I give and bequeath to her and
to her heirs the above named residue of my estate in
which I now live. I do hereby constitute and
appoint my true and faithful friends James
Hammock and John Nichols both of the County
of Sevier and State of Tennessee my Executors of this
will and testament. Be witness whereof I subscribe
at my home and affix my seal this 7th day
of June in the year of our Lord 1841.

I further bequeath to my said wife all my stock of the cattle now on hand including, Horses Cows and Hogs and all other diminution of stock together with all my household furniture and finishing utensils to be and belong to said Lucy Freeman during her natural life after the decease of my aforesaid wife Lucy Freeman the aforesaid tract of land bequeathed to my wife Lucy will next to and become the property of my son John Freeman, the negro Robin above named and bequeathed as above to Lucy Freeman will after her decease become the property of my son Eliza Freeman, the negroes Reuben and Abram above described and bequeathed as above to my wife Lucy will at her decease next to and become the property of my daughter Eliza Davis. The Household Furniture above described and bequeathed together with the stock above described, also finishing utensils to become at the decease of my wife Lucy the properties of my son John and my daughter Eliza to be between them equally divided, I also give and bequeath to my sons Robert Foster and James Jr.

and State of Tennessee being weak of body but of perfect mind
and memory thanks be given to God calling to mind the
mortality of my body and knowing it is now
appointed for me to sit or to stand and remain
this my last will and Testament. That is to say
first fully and of all, I give and recommend
my soul into the hands of blessed God then give
to and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried
in a decent Christian burial at the direction of my
Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resur-
rection I shall receive the same again by the mighty
power of God, and as touching such worldly estate
wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life
I give devise and dispose of the same in the following
manner and form, First I give to my son James
I Warren the hundred acres of land on the lower
end of my plantation, Likewise I give to my son Rolly
M. Warren the hundred acres of land on the upper end
of said plantation to be laid off by my Executors, the
balance of my plantation at my death I give to
my son Joshua M. Warren and one negro worth
seventy dollars in trade at my death I desire that
my negro woman Nancy be set free, Likewise at my
death I desire that my four negroes, namely one girl
named Mary, three boys, viz. Smith Cook, Aaron and Nathan
be equally divided by my Executors between my
three daughters viz. Pamelia M. Warren, Elizabeth H. Warren
and Nancy M. Warren each to be clothed and shod
is to have each of them a horse worth seventy
dollars in trade and a saddle for each of them out
of my Estate the balance of my estate I desire to be
sold immediately after my death and after pay-
ing all just debts and funeral expenses the remain-
der to be equally divided between my six children, namely
James I. Warren Rolly M. Warren Pamelia I. Warren
Joshua M. Warren Elizabeth H. Warren and Nancy M.
Warren, and Likewise I give and bequeath to my six
wives children namely as follows, Charles H. Warren
and William B. Warren, Martin Conway, Samuel
David Brown, S. Warren, Samuel E. Warren
