 and now that the provisions of this my foregoing last will and testament
 may be carried into full and complete execution and effect and to per-
 form and to perform the same I have and do hereby appoint my true
 and worthy friends Robert Porter Egan and General William Drake both of
 the County of Blount and State of Tennessee my executors of this my
 last will and testament and do hereby bestow them with full and

 5th I bequeath my upper plantation to my son Harvey by him paying
 my son Hugh two hundred dollars. 6th I bequeath to my son
 Hugh the two hundred dollars is that he is to get from my two Sons
 Phillip and John as above and two hundred dollars from my son
 Harvey as above for his portion and lastly I appoint my son Phillip
 and Perry alternately my executors in over this my last will and
 testament may be lawfully executed in witness whereof I have here-
 unto set my hand and Seal on the day and date first above

 for the love and affection I have for her three hundred dollars in Cash and it
 is my will that my wife Mary live after my death in the house where now live
 during her natural life if she choose and that she be amply provided for
 during her natural life of my funds. Thirdly I give and bequeath to my
 son Elias Kitch and his heirs the farm the farm that I now live on, Thirdly
 it is my will that all my personal property be sold to the highest bidder and
 that the proceeds with all my money be equally divided between Margaret
 Deannad Rebecca Kitch and her heirs and her son Deannad sister Ham-
 mon and her heirs Mary Johnson and her heirs and if she is dead nothing
 is to be paid until the time comes after it themselves. It is my will that Julia
 in Keweenaw Sharp have a horse worth fifty dollars lastly I do hereby
 nominate and appoint My Son Elias Kitch my executors in witness
 whereof I do to this my will set my hand and Seal this 5th day of
 October 1848.

I in the name of God Amen. I Abner Harr of the State of
 Tennessee and County of Blount being Sick and weak in body but
 finding my mind strong and my judgement sound-blessed be God and
 calling to mind the frailty of man and the certainty of death
 do think it my duty and I solemnly swear and enjoin this my last
 will and testament to wit-I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elisbeth
 1st one third part of the tract of land and plantation on which
 I now live including my dwelling house and all other necessary
 buildings, the land to be so laid off to her by my executors as she
 shall deem most advantageous to her and that heirs forever by running the
 division line such report Comers as shall best suit the convenience of
 each part of my tract of land. And if my 2^d wife should in future day think
 it best and best so to do she may give up her third part of said land
 to the executors to sell with the other part of the land and the
 third part of the said land or money arising from the sale of
 off the tract of land be retained in the hands of my
 executors and if she wishes it to be layed out in the other lands
 and putting such in improvements on it as she may need or if she
 wishes it to be put on interest and the interest to be paid to her
 and the interest paid over to her annually during her natural life I hereby
 instruct my executors to do so and after her death the money
 arising from the sale of her third of the land to be equally
 divided amongst all my children as I give and
 bequeath to my wife Elisbeth 1st all my house hold
 and kitchen furniture also all my farming utensils all
 my live stock to wit horses cattle hogs & sheep &c. to be
 and remain with her for her use and any children then born
 live with me to wit my son Joseph Elisbeth Eliza and Malissa to use and
 distribute to their 2^d children as she may think proper and all my other
 estate to wit all the money within me and debts coming to me

and the money arising from the rents of the other parts of my land and plantation as it is my saddest desire in relation to the same I shall offer to sell it to advantage to all the heirs who may be united the proceeds to be equally divided amongst my children and when under the same with all our in and among after paying all just due debts this may be against me I wish equally divided amongst my children to wit my daughter Rachel Parker my daughter Sarah Chapman my son Joseph Harris my son Jacob Harris my daughter Elizabeth Harris my daughter Hannah Morrison my daughter Eliza Harris my son Mahan Harris and I do hereby appoint my worthy friends George Johnson and William Briggs to be my heirs and sole executors in witness whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal this 10th day of May 1824

I Susannah Henderson of the County of Blount and State of Tennessee being advanced in age and knowing the vicinity of death and believing it to be advisable to dispose of my estate while blessed with the enjoyment of my proper mind do hereby make this my last will and testament in manner and form following Viz First I desire after my death that my body shall be decently buried and funeral expenses paid next my just debts if there be any 2^d I give and bequeath to Susannah Henderson of Gillespie my sign manual and her children and her increase if any forever 3^d I wish bequeath to my nephew William Gillespie my clothing Plate and Clock 4th I give and bequeath to my heirs and heirs heirs heirs each one bedstead bed and clothing the bedstead were to be divided into three equal parts and given to Susannah H. Gillespie and Susannah H. Stone and Mary Henderson 5th I wish now bequeath to Jas Caldwell our one horse worth fifty dollars in trade 6th I give and bequeath to Susannah H. Stone all my kitchen furniture the Cupboard and side table and the balance of my bedsteads beds clothes and my own wearing clothes and all my household furniture not before disposed of my negro Doss and Strick Oxen Cattle Sheep and every article of every kind to be equally divided between Wm. Anderson and John Stone 7th I should not wish I allow the crop on hand to be equally divided between said Gillespie and Mr. Johnson my large Kettle I give to Mary Henderson 8th my keys my Jack's son John Henderson to him for his kindness to me during my sickness if he is willing to take him at that price if not the boy Jacob may be sold by my executor for the most that he will bring the money that will be made out of my boy Jack's son after paying debts and expenses to be divided between Susannah and Stone and Wm. Henderson and it is my wish that every thing herein disposed of shall be divided among the same as my intention having and sold and lastly I do hereby appoint John Anderson and John Stone of this my last will and testament nothing and nothing null and void all and every former will or testaments by me made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this second day of August in the year of our Lord

In the name of God Amen I John Harris of the County of Blount being sick and weak of body but of a sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of such worldly substance as it hath pleased God to bless me with I do hereby dispose of the same in the manner following Viz 1st I desire that my land and exposed to public sale and if it should not go at its valuation to be retained and return over unto it can be disposed of for its value 2^d I desire that of my children Jane Robert Peter get my Brother Henry and the rest to my Mother during her lifetime or until there may be other provisions made that is if David and Henry should be settled to themselves and it was judged proper by my executor I wish John Henry and Peggy go to Henry and the others to David but if it is not judged proper I wish them disposed of as shall be judged of more proper and I wish them to be educated or at least taught to read the word of God and in relation to the principles of morality and virtue and I desire that a sum of 50 cents each of the three sets of children if necessary could be explained in a sum again at the same value when needed by the children and the clothing and bedding and such other household stuff and spinning mack as shall be considered needful be equally divided and managed for the children use and I desire that my two sets of the oldest with Robert and the other with John to be raised for them and put to their use and I desire that a gift such as one of them be provided for James out of my property and raised for his use and I desire that the Culbrand furniture be equally divided between Henry and Jane and that my clothing be divided among such of my brothers as the money says and their value replaced to the children in such things as they may need and next I desire that so many of my just debts as can be discharged out of my property and all others with my money that may arise therefrom and all property that remains exposed to sale and the money arising therefrom together with every thing that may remain in possession after paying my just debts and funeral expenses be equally divided among my three children as the money arises to them on a station of life to meet it lastly I do hereby appoint my three brothers James Robert and Samual Houille executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me hereunto made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 2^d day of July 1823
