Houghes Thomas McSott Robert & Henry two William Houghes have my land and other property to be equally division between them and I want my executors or my sons to pay Mary E. Houghes balance of her share in money to make her equal in nature whereof I have reserued to my hand and affixed my seal this 8<sup>th</sup> day of May 1856.

New, Houghes and my Son Houghes the house and land for raising and Debelling horses till they are of age 5<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my Son James Houghes a certain Gray filly claimed by him 6<sup>th</sup> I order that my land and negro and farming utensils and Stock and family is kept together for the space of five years if things so last by my beloved brothers John Houghes and Samuel Houghes and bequeath one hundred dollars to Phily Jane the daughter of Cynthia Dyer which I consider and they of age and I will and bequeath to my two grand Children Houghes & Andrew Gable when of age One hundred dollars each 7<sup>th</sup> I allow my land and negro and all other property to be equally divided among all my children except my two Grand Children Houghes & Andrew Gable Gally Jane Dyer all to receive their portion when of age I do hereby disown all other wills and testaments and appoint John Houghes and William McCor my executors in hopes they will take the charge in interest about I have hermit Let my hand and Seal this 12<sup>th</sup> 1852

In the name of God Amen I William Rumphys of the County of Blount and State of Tennessee being of advanced age and weak of body but of sound mind for which I thank God and bring division to disposing of my worldly property that is hath pleased God to bless me with in manner following First it is my will that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid I will unto the wife of my oldest Son John Rumphys twenty dollars to be equally divided amongst them also to his Son Thaddeus my Soddy one Soddy and bridle I will unto my daughter Elizabeth McCor one dollar I will unto my Son David Rumphys one dollar I will unto my Son William L. Rumphys one dollar I will unto my Son C. McCor one dollar I will unto my Son James Rumphys twelve dollars I will unto my Son Dennis L. Rumphys one dollar I will unto my daughter Peggy Gray one dollar I will unto my Son Alex and Rumphys one of my property that is on the plantation having hitherto expected to him a title for the land there being a division made by my Sons Alexander and Samuel in Samuels lifetime which is recorded in Court in which division my Sons executors is to leave my Son Samuels house according to said division my will
