of Tennessee Considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of
sound mind and memory (Blessed be god for the same) do make and
publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following
and is by & my last & give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Betsey
the privilege of my Mansion house and other my houses as also the exclusive
benefits of that part of my tract of land in which I now reside all the resi-
dence part of it above described by the line running from the bridge north
to a cross fence east of the line or running from west to east to be in excess
all north of that fence but the said western part where my wife is
to inherit I also bequeath to my said wife five Acres of land and
Orrick and Salley and Anna and little boy Cal & Harrison also four
head of horses and a bay mare and two Sorrel mares a good horse
a team of oxen and my South also two cows and calves some young colts
besides also my stock of hogs and sheep also all my household furni-
ture to be at her disposal between herself and children also four pairs of
shears and four pairs of plows which she receive an undi-
vided ownership during her natural life and may make such dis-
position of the above said personal property amongst our children
as her prudence may direct & further will that my Maguire Julian
Wells and four oxen and the land and timber of my late Sashay
South of Nine mile Creek shall be for the mutual benefit of my
children on which I have and do divide second hereof absent
I have given to my daughter Eliza her full share hereto
fore thirdly hereof remark that I have given nothing to my Sons
viz. John D. and Benjamin & their full share of my property after
giving to Benjamin & the field immediately above the hills and two
hundred acres in which the said live and also to divide the profits
of the said and said miles mutually between my wife and Son
of Benjamin & leaving my wife nothing then to belong to Benjamin
& exclusively fourthly desire I give and bequeath in addition to
what I have already given to my Son Julian & my wife
say day into the possession of occupying this farm so long

all thing shall belong to my wife and Son William Walter & shall be ex-
clusively Wm. Walter as my wife's death & fifth & give to my Son Alfred Burton

Eliza Louisa her portion of my estate but will give to my Son William
Walter mutual benefits with his mother while she lives of that part of
my farm and plantation on which I now live which has not been
otherwise appropriated at the death of my wife my Son William Walter
shall be the exclusive proprietor of all that part of my farm which
he and his mother are to mutually share as aforesaid to gather with
such personal property as may be necessary to him by his mother and
or last wife he residing with his mother and taking care of her while
she lives and shall also have my Negro boy Tom and Cotton gin
Eighth & will give to my daughter Betsey Adeline my dear girl
Katy and to my daughter Rebecca Anna my dear girl Eliza and
also to my Daughter Polly Mildred & give my negro girl Sarah
also of give to my three last mentioned daughters each a good novice
a pair of saddle and bridles and household furniture at their
mothers discretion and be privileged to a home with their mother and
Brother Wm. Walter as long as they may remain single. Ninth & will that
my children who are now handy and should wish it may be at liberty
to go their own way in the said mill the clause to be repeated by
my Son Benjamin & notwithstanding the said Saw mill has been given
to him in a foreign service & title us to my personal property
which I possess not particularly mentioned above such residence & will
that it be your to publish & all giving such time and credit as
my executors hereafter appointed & sole claim for the mutual benefit of
all concerned done. Tenth I hereby make appoint and ordain my
two Sons Cornelius and William Walter my executors to carry into effect
all the clauses of this my last will and testament and that they be
required to make the best profit of which the amount of unappropriated
personal property & shall be equally divided between all my daughters
and my executors, and my two executors above appointed now finally
I hereby assign it in all the estates of my estate that should it
be contrary to my wish any dispute should arise between any of them
respecting any of the clauses of this my last will that the contending
parties shall each choose an honest intelligent disinterested
man and should they not agree for them to choose a third man
a majority dividing whose decision shall be final and any one of them
refusing to finally settle all such disputes in the way and mode
prescribed in this clause shall thereby forfeit their interest in any
part of my estate in witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and affixed my seal this 28th day of July 1840.

I now all done by these presents that I Benjamin D. Howard of the County of Blount and State of Tennessee being determined by an afflicted body that I shall shortly be called on to pay the last debt of nature but being of sound and disposing mind I do hereby make and constitute and publish this my last will and testament. And first it is my will and desire that at my death my body be buried in a Christian manner. 2nd it is my will and desire that my beloved wife Mrs. Mary Howard have the care raising and educating of my dear children 3rd it is my will and desire that after my decease that my said wife Sophia Howard as long as she remains a widow have my farm as the interest vested in me by the will of my dear father for the time this and two miles all the houses tools and Kitchen furniture one horse bridle that is my mare known by the name of Kit my wagon and 200 of Cows one cow and Calf and the oldest heifer of said Cow after my black log Cabin. 4th it is my will and desire that my executors have power to dispose of the residue of my property as they in their judgment may think will be of the greatest advantage to my dear children except my Sheep which it is my will and desire that my beloved wife should have them 5th it is my will and desire that Alfred B. Howard and Calvin M. Howard be the Executors to carry this my last will and testament into effect and now in testimony of my full intent to all and every part of this my last will and testament I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 11th day of December 1843 witness Robert H. Houston

John H. H. of the County of Blount and State of Tennessee being somewhat afflicted in bodily health and knowing the uncertainty of death but of sound mind and disposing memory do make my will and testament in manner and form following viz: after my decease I wish my body buried in a plain decent manner and my burial expenses paid out of any money in hand, also I bequeath to my wife Rachel H. Alexander all of the homestead buildings barn Stables Crib &c. and all suitable Support out of the proceeds of said farm and ten hundred dollars in cash including what my Son Blount gave to her at his death and one young brown mare four years old and as much of the cattle hogs and Sheep Stock as she wishes to keep for her own use, also all of the Household and Kitchen furniture of every description and the wagon and tools of red Copper and forming utensils of every description to be kept by her in said farm for the use of said farm during her natural life or widowhood. Secondly I bequeath to my Son Hugh W. H. Alexander all the land of possess in the County of Blount he now lives on also agree or lot of land being a part of my house tract of land beginning in a Stake corner between me and said Danaldson then a straight line thence west to a forked black oak an original corner to S^t H. Alexander's tract of land and the Steagold entry from thence a straight line to a cross fence next to the road leading to S^t H. Alexander's then along the South side of S^t H. fence through the field to a road leading to S^t H. Parker's for my house with the same to S^t H. Parker's and my corner thence into Brown's line to S^t H. Daniel's line then with S^t H. Donaldson's line to the right being supposed to be fifty acres totally I bequeath to my Daughter Delia B. all the sum of five hundred dollars in addition to what I heretofore gave her to be paid out of any money due me as soon as it can be collected after my decease 4th I bequeath to my Son Dr. James Ramsey H. Alexander my entire home stead tract or tracts of land except the lot bequeathed to my Son Hugh W. H. Alexander I bequeath to my wife Delia all the balance of said home farm bequeathed to be two hundred acres to aforementioned Dr. James Ramsey and all the subservient money on hand if there be any after paying up all of said legatees claims and all my other expenses to be equally divided between myself and other legatees. It is my will that the S^t H. W. H. Alexander take the black stock of Cows and one yearling male Colt and S^t H. Ramsey the old mares Suckling Calf of the horse called Duke can be disposed of any of the foregoing property my executors shall have authority to dispose of all such articles as are not herein disposed of and lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint Alexander S. H. Hugh W. H. Alexander Dr. James Ramsey Executor of this my will and testament. It is my will that my executors take possession and dispose of my entire estate according to the provisions of this will without giving security in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 24th of the Seventh Month or July in the Eighteen hundred and fifth year.
