I Jane Hacking do make and publish this as my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me at any time made. First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my just debts be paid as soon after my decease as possible out of any money that I may or possessed of or may first come into the hands of my executors. Secondly I will and bequeath unto my Son Thomas Hacking a tract of land containing forty acres more or less purchased by me from Aaron Hacking my son deceased. Also one other tract containing forty seven and one half acres with the exception of a part to be hereafter named it being an entry made by me (See Deed No. 20, 934) forward the said Francis Houston. I shall pay my executors the sum of two hundred and twenty five dollars to be equally divided into five yearly installments. And in case the said Francis Hacking I shall refuse to comply with the above condition I will and bequeath unto him the sum of five dollars in the first and I reserve it in my executors to sell the same and the proceeds thereof after settling apart the sum of fifty dollars which is to be appropriated in schooling my Son Aaron Thompson to be equally divided amongst my daughters Emily, Nancy Elizabeth, Lucinda Pittman and Sarah my Son born Thompson. Thirdly I will and bequeath to my brother Thomas Jones a part of the farm named Trust See Grant No. 20, 934. Beginning at Conventional corner run by Aaron Hacking from Dashed between Joseph Pittman and myself since running with the line of said Pittman now Pittman goes to a corner of an entry made by Edward Wilmotland there with the same to John Hacking his line there with C. Hacking his to a black oak corner there then a straight line to the beginning. And lastly I constitute and appoint my brother Thomas Jones and John Hacking my executors of this my last will and testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twentieth day of the seventh month (July) in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty one.

Hickey is also to have the use of my gray Parry while he remains on the place and after he leaves the Parry is to be given to Robert Bedford. I also direct that one tenth the proceeds arising from the perishable property so soon as it can be sold, and the money collected with one tenth of all other care the estate so soon as they can be collected be divided equally between the following benevolent institutions. One third to the Southern Western and Theological Seminary located at Maryville Tennessee, one third to the American Sunday School Union, and one third to the American Board for Foreign Missions and the remainder be vested together with the annual interest in some safe Bank or other institution for five years. I also direct that my interest in the mills on the waters of Pistol Creek be rented out for the space of five years at the expiration of which time said interest is to be sold, and that my daughter Sidney A. Houston receive out of the profits of the rent one hundred dollars per annum for her own use, and if the rent should not amount to one hundred dollars per annum the remainder is to be furnished her out of the interest of the vested money. I further direct that the several tracts and parcels of land not otherwise divided lying in the counties of Blount and Knox two other with one far bank in Jefferson County and one lot situated in the town of Louis ville Blount County be sold at the option of my executors within the space of five years and that a tenth part of the proceeds of said land be divided equally between the following benevolent institutions. One third to the Southern Western and Theological Seminary located at Maryville Tennessee. One third to the American Sunday School Union and one third to the American Board for Foreign Missions. I further direct that the whole residence of my real and perishable estate at the expiration of five years or so soon thereafter as it can be collected be divided in the following manner. One tenth to my Grand Son James Pittman son of John Pittman one tenth to Jane Houston and her heirs. One tenth to Lucy Wood Pittman and her heirs. One tenth to James Gallagher and his heirs. One tenth to Robert Bedford and his heirs. One tenth to William Moore and his heirs. One tenth to William Patrick and his heirs. One tenth to James Bedford and his heirs one tenth to Crookin Bedford and his heirs. And one tenth to my daughter Sidney A. Houston Note well. I recommend my heirs to appropriate as much of their several portions of this estate as they can conveniently to the benevolent institutions of the age in which they live.

I hereby appoint sole Executrix of this my last will and testament Doctor James H. Pittman Maywood Blount and Robert M. of Tennessee Considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of
sound mind and memory (Blessed be God for the same) as made and
published this my last will and testament in manner and form following
and is to say first I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Betsey
the privilege of my Mansion house and other wt houses as also the exclusive
benefits of that part of my tract of land on which I now reside all the wa-
ter part of it when divided by the line running from the bridge north
to a cross fence east of the line & running from west to east to inclose
all north of that fence into the said western part which my wife is
to inherit I also bequeath to my said wife five Negroes viz. No son and
one black and white girl and little boy Callie Harrison also five
head of horse kind a bay mare and two Sorrel mares a Sorrel horse
a team of oxen and my Cart also two cows and calves some young cattle
besides also my Stock of hogs and sheep also all my Household furni-
ture to be at her disposal between herself and children also four pairs of
hose lace and four pairs of Plows which she receive an undi-
vided ownership during her natural life and may make & use dis-
possession all of the above said personal property amongst her children
as her judgment may direct I further will that my Negroes Callie
Harrison and four Oxen and the land and timber of my late Esqury
south of Five miles Creek shall be for the mutual benefit of my
whole farm on which I have and do reside secondly I resolve
I have given to my Daughter Eliza Hartise her full share here-
fore thirdly I will remark that I have given herfelf to my Sons
viz. John Jr. and Benjamin & their full share of my property ap-
portioning to Benjamin & the field immediately above the hills and two
hundred rods in which the Miller lies and also to divide the profits
of the Saw and Grist mills mutually between my wife and Son
Benjamin & during my wife lifetime then to belong to Benjamin
& exclusively fourthly I give and bequeath in addition to
what I have already given to my Son Johnston or my Hogs
by him into the possession of occupying the same land so long

as he remains on the premises where he now live when he removes the Land and buildings shall belong to my wife and Son William Walter & shall be ex-
clusively Mr. Walter as my wife's death & fifth - to give to my Son Alfred Boston
the several fractions of land I own on Four mile Creek in Blount County
also my sign man also Sixthly I remark to have given my daughter
Eliza Louise her portion of my estate but will give to my Son William
Walter mutual benefits with his mother while she lives of that part of
my farm and plantation on which I now live which has not been
otherwise appropriated at the death of my wife my Son William Walter
shall be the exclusive proprietor of all that part of my farm which
he and his mother are to mutually share as upon said to gather with
such personal property as may be necessary to him by his mother and
or last wife he residing with his mother and taking care of her while
she lives and shall also have my negro boy Tom and Lottie give
Eighthly I will give to my daughter Betsey Adeline my Slave Give
Katy and to my daughter Rebecca Brown my negro girl Eliza and
also to my Daughter Polly Maudred I give my negro girl Sarah
also to give to my three last mentioned daughters each a good nose bridle
a saddle and bridles and household furniture at their
mothers discretion and be privileged to a home with their mother and
Brother Mr. Walter as long as they may remain single Ninthly I will that
my Children & I will have and should wish it may be at liberty
to all their own Sowing on the Saw Mill the clause to be repeated by
my Son Benjamin & not withstanding the Saw Mill has been given
to him in a foreign service I will as to my personal property
which of possess not particularly mentioned above such relation I will
that it be open to publick sale & giving such time and credit as
my executors hereinafter appointed shall deem for the mutual benefit of
all concerned alike tenthly I hereby make appoint and ordain my
two Sons Cornelius and William Walter my executors to carry into effect
all the articles of this my last will and testament and that there be
no need to make the best profit of which the amount of unappropriated
personal property & shall be equally divided between all my daughters
and my executors and my two executors above appointed now finally
I hereby inform it in all the legatees of my estate that should it
be contrary to my wish any dispute should arise between any of them
respecting any of the articles of this my last will that the court
of law parties shall each choose an honest intelligent witness
man and should they not agree for them to choose a third man a
majority deciding whose decision shall be final and any one of them
refusing to finally settle all such disputes in the way and mode
prescribed in this clause shall thereby forfeit their interest in any
part of my estate in articles whosesoever have heretofore set my
hand and affixed my seal this 28th day of July 1840
