To all whom these presents may come or be made known know
ye that I Johnston Jones Senr of the County of Blount and State
of Tennessee being weak of body but of sound mind and disposing
memory and Calling to mind the mortality of my body do make
relieve and constitute this my last will and testament in form and
manner following 1st it is my will that my just debts and funeral
expenses be paid out of my personal estate

2^d I give and bequeath to my Son John Jones my Wagon on hand
paying what remains due and unpaid of the price thereof

3^d I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Nancy Jones the plau-
tation wherein I now live during her Natural life or in de-
faut 4th in the death or marriage of my wife Nancy Jones it
is my will that the plantation wherein I now live be divided by
a line running as near the middle of the ledge of Rocks that pass
as through it as can be ascertained the South division of
said land I give and bequeath unto my Son John Jones his
heirs and assigns forever, the north division of said land I
give and bequeath unto my said Son Johnston Jones to him
his heirs and assigns forever.

5th I give and bequeath unto my Sons James John and John-
ston a lot of woodland lying in the Woods to be equally divi-
ded between them to them their heirs and assigns forever

6th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Betty and Re-
becca Jones a lot of land I own on Holston River lying between
them and at their death to my Grand Son William Jones Son
of my Son Samuel to him his heirs and assigns forever
7th I give and bequeath to my Son Samuel Jones and my daugh-
ter Martha Jones one dollar each to be paid out of my per-
sonal estate 8th the residue and remainder of my personal es-
tate I give and bequeath unto my wife Nancy Jones and my
daughter Betty Rebecca Nancy and Jane Jones to be equally
divided between them after the making my daughter Frances
McCall's portion with what she has already got equal to her
Martha's brn 9th her legem.

9th I do hereby revoke and constitute my Sons John Jones
and Johnston Jones with my wife Nancy Jones executors of
this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former
wills by me made and constituting this and this only my
last will and testament, in testimony whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this 7th day of the Month of June 1831

memory and Calling to mind the uncertainty of life and cer-
tainty of death do make and make this as my last will
and testament hereby revoking all other wills
heretofore made by me, it is my will and desire that all my
just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate

in the first place 2nd I give and bequeath to each of my brothers
and Sisters James Jones Isaac Jones Charles Jones Margaret Jones
and Jeremiah Ellis one dollar as a token of affection and remembrance
they each being situated remote from me. 3rd I give and bequeath to
my other brother David Jones and Sister Nancy Jones the remaining
part of a thirty dollar note that I hold on my brother David after
paying to my above named brothers and Sisters one dollar each out
of my said note to be equally divided between them part and
part alike that is one half of the remainder of said note to David
Jones and the other half to Nancy Jones, my younger brother and Sister
that are with me as a parting remuneration for their tender care and kind
attention during my many afflictions. 4th I give and bequeath
after the foregoing legacies and expenses are paid out of my estate
all and every thing that way in any wise belong to or appertain
to my estate unto my kind and loving Mother Rebecca Jones (to sign
upon at my decease and hold the same as her own) or as soon
after my decease as my affairs can be settled up by my executors
at all having disposed of the same whomever a Divine Providence shall
blessed me in the way and manner in which is agreeable to my
mind. I lastly leave my Mother Isaac Jones and David Jones
my executors to this my last will and testament. Signed
Sealed and published this 12th of the 3rd Month 1834 in
presence of us and the under signed names subscribed as witnesses

of Tennessee hereby make my last will and testament in
manner and form following that is 1st I devise that my real estate
be immediately sold after my decease and out of the moneys
arising therefrom in the first place my just debts all to be
paid and 2^d I give to my Son Andrew Jackson thirty five
dollars to be paid in trade 3^d I give to Samuel Cook thirty
five dollars also to be paid in trade 4th I give to James Logan
one half the balance of the price of my land after the above
mentioned is paid 5th I give to my daughter Mary Ann the
remainder of the price of the land and also all my house-
hold furniture also all my money and notes and bonds
and all other of my perishable property and lastly I do
hereby constitute and appoint my friends James Scott and
John Dunlop executors of this my last will and testament her-
by revoking all other or former wills or testaments by me heretofore
made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal this thirteenth day of June and in the year of our Lord
1814.
