First that all my just debts be paid and funeral charges paid and bequeath to my wife Jane Lytle all my Stock of Cattle Hogs and Sheep all my household and kitchen furniture to be wholly at her disposal also all my books I give and bequeath to my eldest Son John E. Lytle my plantation on which I now live one Scotch morn and my tools and farming utensils. Only that he is obligated to support his mother Jane Lytle during her natural life. I give and bequeath to my Son William one hundred dollars to be paid to him by my Son John E. Lytle when said William M. Lytle is twenty one years of age also to my Son Alfred M. Lytle ten hundred dollars to be paid to him when he comes of age by my Son John E. Lytle also to my daughter Mary Ann M. Lytle one horse and saddle valued to Sixty five dollars. These three last bequests are to be paid by my Son John E. Lytle in account of the legacy I gave him. And lastly I appoint and constitute Charles H. Sheddan Executor of this my last will and testament. Witness my hand and Seal 28th day of June 1834.

In the name of God Amen I David Logan of the State of Tennessee and County of Belmont being sick and weak of body but of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly substance as it has pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath the sum in the manner following that is to say first I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Hannah one third of all my estate both real and personal for and during the term of her life and after her death I give the same to my children hereinafter named and to him my beloved wife the remaining two thirds of all the books and household furniture to dispose of the same at her own pleasure to make up any deficiency to either if she judges there be any except one bed and furniture Books and Clock the books at her death to be equally divided amongst all my children. Secondly to my fair beloved daughter Hannah M. Rachel Eli's child and Peggy Ann the three youngest a portion equal to the eldest she having renounced all at and shortly after her marriage except five dollars which is now bequeathed to her to be discharged in good trade to Peggy Ann twenty two dollars in good trade to Eli's child eight dollars in good trade to Rachel two dollars in good trade. These three last bequestments are considered necessary to make the three younger equal to the eldest in what she received previous to her marriage. The also to have their portion exclusive of this as above stated third to my beloved Grand daughter Prudence Thompson if living to the age of eighteen a two year old huffer and five dollars in money for with my beloved Grand daughter Prudence Logan a good year old huffer fifth to my beloved Son Alexander Logan I give

I give and bequeath ten acres of land with a small improvement made by Robert M. Kelly on the same being part of the tract he now holds and eight dollars more for his land. Six to my beloved Son James M. Logan thirty seven dollars which gave him in assisting him in paying for his land. to my beloved Son David I Logan ten dollars in money and thirty three in trade going for his land. Eight to my beloved Son John M. Logan any my Scotch horse which he has claimed a right in the feather bed above excepted the farming utensils the farm also at his mother's death and lastly as near Consistent and apposite My Friends Alexander James R. and David I Logan Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other or former wills or testaments by me heretofore made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this eighth day of May in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and twenty six
