In the name of God Amen Elijah Brown of the State of Tennessee and County of Blount 1st being in a low state of health but of a sound mind and judgment and calling to mind the frailties of man the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time when I shall make my last will and testament I do hereby give and bequeath my soul to God who gave it and my body to the dust to be buried in a Christian like manner at the expense of my heirs I do give and bequeath unto my aged mother a decent maintenance and decent burial at her death. I do give and bequeath my beloved brother David Brown one bond horse - I do give and bequeath to my beloved wife Polly Brown the remainder of my estate both real and personal to be completely paid out while she lives and be disposed of by her at her death, as she may think proper after all my just debts are paid. Except five shillings apiece to each of my brothers and sisters not heretofore received and I do hereby appoint my beloved wife Polly Brown and Joseph Henderson my sole and sole Executors of this my last will and testament 2^d Signed in the presence of us this 27th day of December 1814.

in the name of God Amen I Samuel Martin the use of all my negroes during her life or as long as she may wish to hold them but may devise them in the following manner among my children at any time that she may think proper to my son Halden I give Pickett I also give I give to my son Mark I also give I give to my son Henry I give I also give Charlotte to my daughter Polly I also give David to my daughter Rebecca and Rebecca to my daughter Joana I also give Henry to my daughter Catherine I further give my daughter Bessy Allen and she is to pay my daughter Rebecca one half of his value at the time she receives him and I further give my daughter Joana Billy and she is to pay my daughter Catherine one half of his value whenever she receives him I further direct that Jude be left at her liberty at any time or season to live with which of my children she pleases - 3^d I leave all my personal estate to the use of my wife during her life or pleasure then to be divided equally among my children namely Rosa and my daughter Joana Mark Catherine and John I further direct that my wife keep account of all that she may give to my dear children so that they may be able to come to an equal settlement at her death - 4th and lastly I ordain my wife Sarah Martin my Executors to this my last will and testament witness my hand and seal this day and date above written

In the name of God Amen I James Witherspoon of Blount County and State of Tennessee being weak in body but of perfect mind and memory calling to mind that all men must die do make and ordain this my last will and testament first of all I recommend my soul to God that give us and our bodies to the earth to be buried with a decent Christian Buriall and as to what God hath blessed us with of the good things of this world I give and bequeath in the following manner and first my wife is first my tract of land in Blount County and siting between the equerry and the river my well beloved wife Margaret and Thomas Smith - I will second I herbally Entrusted and sold to James B. Rogers a tract of land in Blount County for two hundred dollars to be paid in March Eighteen hundred and eleven forty dollars of which is paid said lands I promised to make a transfer title out of the balance of said two hundred dollars and fifty dollars worth of Books in the hand of John M. Gammitt of Knoxville and my wife is that all my lawful cash debts be discharged of any balance of these sums after my debts are paid I bequeath it to my wife Margaret - Item 3^d I give and bequeath to Thomas M. Smith the half of my stock of hogs and sheep and one cow - Item fourth I give and bequeath to James Mitchell my brood mare Pan also a two year old Filly named high flow also a two year old Colt named Muddy - Item fifth the balance of my property I give and bequeath to my wife Margaret I do hereby recommend and appoint my wife Margaret Thomas M. Smith and William M. B. Smith Executors of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighth day of August one thousand eight hundred and twelve James Witherspoon (seal)

My last will is as follows My soul I resign to God that gave it - 2 - My body I resign to the earth from whence it came the rest of my worldly goods as follows the land divided beginning at a White Oak at the Big Spring running to a post Oak from thence to a black oak near the new field from thence to a large black Oak on the top of the ridge the lower part I gave to Sam^l Shaver and the wife of Allen Shaver and his heirs forever and the balance of the land is to be left in the hands of my wife for her maintenance and at her death to come to my youngster Polly the said land for future to be left in the hands
