Likewise one cotton what one chest and two chairs I further will that each of my daughters Sarah Caroline and Elisabeth Jane shall have one fourth of the kitchen furniture and one one Sarah Caroline Elisabeth Jane shall have a horse worth fifty dollars and a cow and calf at the time that my youngest son Richard Lafayette Creswell becomes twenty one or before that time provided payment can be made without embarrassment or inconvenience to the whole family after providing Christy blacking for the family they feel clothing that may be made shall be divided equally between Sarah Caroline and Elisabeth Jane after all the above obligations are complied with I further will and bequeath to my son William Campbell and Richard Lafayette Creswell my lawful estate together with the balance of my personal property to be equally divided between them at the time that Richard Creswell arrives at the age of twenty one year I do hereby make and give and appoint Andrew Crissell and Albert L. Boyle Executors of this my last will and testament.
